Book Title: Where We Live **Author:** Margriet Ruurs

Introduction

Begin by asking students:

- How would you describe where you live to someone who has never been here before?
- Would you be able to describe another community as well?

As we read this story, we will learn about where kids live in 16 different communities around the world.

Reading and Discussion

Because this book has a lot of detail, it might be best to split the areas up and only focus on a few at a time, using a globe to identify the various locations or pull up google maps to show current pictures of each location.

Review map vocabulary on pg. 5: compass rose, legend, scale bar

Possible discussion questions:

- Read through the first 3 locations (Cook Islands, Canada, US) and discuss:
 - What do these places have in common?
 - Output
 How are they different?
- Repeat with the next 3 locations (Honduras, Venezuela, Antarctica)
- Repeat with the next 3 locations (Spain, Netherlands, Romania)
- Repeat with the next 3 locations (Egypt, Ethiopia, Zambia)
- Repeat with the last 4 locations (Pakistan, India, China, Cambodia)
- What was most surprising to you about the communities we visited?

Activity:

Create a map of your community

Now that we have seen maps from different parts of the world, it's your turn to create a map of your community. Be sure to include the following features: school, hospital, church, main roads, your house, compass rose, legend, scale bar.
