3. Casa Del Northern, 300 E. Northern Avenue, Phoenix, Maricopa County, Arizona

- Kupel identified that the count of contributing resources is incorrect in some areas and that needs to be reconciled.
- The committee came to the conclusion that the period of significance should be 1929 to 1968, a paragraph needs to be added to explain that and how there are two contexts within that period of significance.
- Southard noted that it would be helpful to have an integrity section that references all seven aspects.
- Khatri and other members would like to see a stronger argument to emphasize Bennie Gonzales as a master architect, perhaps reference his AIA fellowship and his awards. Kupel asked if there was anything academic about Gonzalez that has been written that could be cited.
- Stein and other members noted that a key for photographs would be helpful due to the large number of photos and contributing properties.
- Stein suggested that each unit's individual street number should be included.

4. Casitas De Castilian, 643 West Las Lomitas Road, Tucson, Pima County, Arizona

- 120 units vs. 30 buildings will be clarified, there are 32 contributing buildings.
- Jeffery is interested in a reference for the Haver biography on Bennie Gonzales.
- Ryden noted that the layout of the buildings is more modern than it is derivative of the Laws of the Indies and would like to see that changed.
- Kupel would like to see a better explanation for the period of significance extending to 1974 and then perhaps some sort of declarative statement that the majority of properties are over 50 years old so that they don't have to meet the criterion consideration.
- Kupel would like to see additional descriptions of the vegetation as it is considered both native and introduced. Which is which?
- Kupel noted some absences in the bibliography – Kerr, 1963; Haver, 2019
- The preference to treating Gonzales as “internationally” not “globally” known.
- Leonard suggested the insertion of a column to make the treatment of structures and objects by individual resources clearer. (Note that the site is being treated as a contributing site.)
- Stein would like more information about the unique topography of the site.

 - Ryden asked for description of how the planar walls also function for fire suppression and how they are not just character defining as far as architecture, that they are a unique, functional take.
 - Lindsey and Khatri noted that there needs to be revision to emphasize that this is being nominated for its architectural design, not just as emblematic of garden apartment development in Tucson. Leonard said it would just take a little bit of reworking to minimize the garden apartment context and maximize the architecture context.
- Leonard made the decision that SHPO staff will move the nomination forward, describing how we are interpreting bulletin 15's guidance on criterion consideration G with the start of construction occurring prior to 50 years.

F. PROGRAM REPORTS

1. SHPO REPORT

a. National Register update, listings, property status, workflow -

Collins reported that since the July 9, 2021 HSRC meeting Properties Listed in National Register include: Glaus House, Paradise Valley; Hunt Farmstead Historic District, Pine; Buckeye Woman's Club, Buckeye; U.S. Courthouse and Federal Building, Phoenix (federal nomination); Cottonwood Commercial Historic District, Cottonwood (Additional Documentation and Boundary Expansion); Flagstaff Townsite Historic District (Additional Documentation); East Prescott Historic District (Additional Documentation); Colonia Solana Historic District, (Additional Documentation); Barrio Libre Historic District (Additional Documentation); Armory Park Historic District (Additional Documentation); Willo Historic District (Additional Documentation); F.Q. Story Historic District (Additional Documentation); Garfield Historic District (Additional Documentation); Medlock Place Historic District (Additional Documentation); and Willo Historic District (Additional Documentation). There are three properties pending at the Keeper of the National Register: Wright, David & Gladys, House, Phoenix; Valley National Bank Phoenix Branch No. 10, Phoenix; and Westwood Village and Estates Historic District, Phoenix.

b. SHPO Staffing and Program News -

Leonard reported that SHPO no longer has a deputy SHPO as Chris Cody left the agency to take a new position at the National Trust for Historic Preservation. The position will be held open as a part of a vacancy savings for this fiscal year. SHPO has a new compliance specialist, Kasey Miller who comes from New Mexico Department of Transportation. Eric Vondy has been promoted to a Planner IV position as Historic Preservation Programs manager.

c. Review and Compliance -

Leonard reported that SHPO had a termination of consultation with the Advisory Council for Historic Preservation on Resolution Copper. SHPO is currently undertaking consultation on Florence Copper. SHPO is engaged in a Section 106 consultation for an adaptive reuse project at the Mountain View Officers Club at Ft. Huachuca. Ft. Huachuca was able to find a military use for the building and SHPO is working with them on a Programmatic Agreement for the project. SHPO is also working with Ft. Huachuca on the Programmatic Agreement for the treatment of buildings associated with privatized housing. SHPO has had some preliminary discussions with the forest service regarding the relicensing of the Snowbowl facility in the Coconino National Forest. It is anticipated to be very contentious due to the presence of a sacred site.

Leonard reported that SHPO has heard from the Bureau of Reclamation that they are going to resume conversations with tribes about fish management associated with the LTEMP project up near the Grand Canyon/Lake Powell area. SHPO is also working on a very involved process for working with state agencies to revise memorandum of understanding for Arizona state Historic Preservation Act compliance. SHPO is hoping the process will result in six to eight new agreement documents including agreement documents for universities.

d. Survey and Inventory -

Nothing new to report.

e. Grants -

At the Federal level, Leonard reported that the National Trust has a new sub-grants from the National Endowment for the Human called the “Telling the Full Story,” grants which are out and Leonard encouraged those interested to apply. They are grants to tell the story of underrepresented communities throughout Arizona. There is the actual underrepresented communities grant from the Park Service. The Civil Rights grant is also out and SHPO is assisting at least one applicant for that grant. At the State level, Leonard reported that SHPO is currently administering \$5 million dollars of the Heritage Fund, \$1.5 million of which is earmarked for historic preservation projects. There is a rolling deadline of applications and awards until all monies are spent. There’s an additional \$5 million dollars of ARPA funds that have been made available by the governor’s office of which \$1.5 million could be spent on historic preservation projects which need to demonstrate that they fulfill a COVID-related, economic hardship that creates the need for the monies.

f. Legislative Issues –

Federal level – The GO Act, which is designed to increase the Historic Tax Credit from the traditional 20 percent credit to 30 percent credit, has had efforts to attach it to the Senate budget reconciliation bill. So far, those efforts have not been successful. The APF is engaged in a write-in campaign with the National Trust to encourage that amendment to the reconciliation bill to get the GO Act in there. The House Budget spending bill passed with \$75 million dollars of discretionary historic preservation funding for the National Parks Service director to be spent over 10 years. U.S. Rep. Grijalva is to thank for that as he came up with the language to include that in the bill. The bill also appropriates \$180 million of HPF funding to SHPO and National Parks grant programs and that is \$35 million more than the year before. The confirmation of Sara Bronin, President Biden’s appointee for the chair of the ACHP, has been delayed and her confirmation hearing will be held in general assembly.

State level – Nothing to report.

g. HP 2021 Conference update –

Leonard reported the conference appears to be a success with over 400 attendees on Friday which reflected the combined Arizona Site Steward and Arizona Historic Preservation conferences. The 2022 HP Conference will be in Yuma during the third week of October.

2. AHAC REPORT

AHAC will be part of the review process for the Historic Preservation Fund grant.
