

Instructions on how to fill out the Learning Agreement (LA)

During the application period, Bachelor's and Master's level students are required to upload, in their application, the Learning Agreement approved by the curriculum expert with the faculty Dean's signature. The Learning Agreement must include courses equivalent to a minimum of 12 ECTS credits that can be recognized within the student's home curriculum. If the host university's minimum credit requirement differs, their requirement will take precedence.

The signed Learning Agreement is mandatory for all students participating in the exchange program, as the post-mobility credit recognition process will depend on it. In the application form, learning agreements must be uploaded separately for each selected university. According to EU recommendations, exchange students are advised to select courses totaling 30 ECTS credits per semester.

Before consulting the Learning Agreement with the relevant curriculum expert, the student must fill in the following sections of the agreement:

- General information
- Mobility type and duration
- Before the mobility - Table A

When filling out the Learning Agreement, the student should refer to the course catalog provided in the information brochure prepared for the host university (if the host university does not have an updated catalog, the student should refer to the most recent version posted on their website). Students must select courses relevant to their academic level at the home university (e.g.: bachelor students can only choose bachelor-level courses, while master's students can only select master-level courses).

The student must send the completed Learning Agreement to the relevant curriculum expert at least one week before the application period ends (see the [list of curriculum experts](#)). Students can expect to receive the signed LA within 5 working days, which should then be uploaded to the application form before the application deadline (refer to the [website](#) for deadlines). During the application period, the student should reach out to the curriculum expert directly via email, without requiring mediation from the International Relations Office.

For PhD and last-semester master's students who do not opt for study component at the host university, it is sufficient to indicate only the title of their research in their LA.
