SUBJECT	OBJECT	POSSESSIVE	DEMONSTRATIVE	INTERROGATIVE (asks a question)	INDEFINITE (not specific)
I (always capitalized)	me	my/mine	this	Which...?	each
you	you	your/yours	that	Whose...?	someone
he	him	his	these	What...?	no one
she	her	hers	those	Who/whom...?	everyone, anyone
it	it	its (no app)			nobody
they	them	their/theirs			both
we	us	our/ours			and more...

First Person Pronouns (including your self in the text)	Second Person Pronouns (for use with commands, recipes, instructions)	Third Person Pronouns (Writing from a perspective viewing experience from outside the text)
I, me, my, myself, we, us	you, your, yours Otherwise writer is unspecific and should refer to specific people, students, etc	he, she, they, it, them
