Why does our dress code matter at Zeta?

At Zeta, families entrust us with their students every day. Maintaining a high level of professionalism demonstrates to families that we take this responsibility seriously and are deserving of their trust. Professional attire sends a visual message to our families, our students, and others that we are trustworthy professionals. Our students show up each day in uniform, ready to learn. Likewise, as adults at Zeta, we must be role models for our students at all times, including in our attire.

What is our general dress code at Zeta?

Our general dress code is **business casual**, as defined in greater detail below. Note that all teammates are expected to follow professional dress during remote days as well.

Meets our Dress Code	Does not Meet our Dress Code
Professional-looking trousers, dress pants, dress skirts, dress shirts (ties optional), blouses, sweaters, dresses, suits, polos, sports coats or an official Zeta polo shirt or jacket Dress shoes and dress socks are the standard footwear. - Heels or dress shoes (including flats) are appropriate. - Note that when touring / shadowing / working in our schools, single-color sneakers are acceptable	Any type of tight or revealing clothing: skirts or dresses that are higher than 2 inches above the knee; spaghetti straps; strapless, low-cut, or midriff-baring tops or dresses; sheer clothing; immodest necklines Jeans; leggings; shorts; sweatpants Denim; sweatshirts; clothing with rips or tears; T-shirts Flip-flops or open-toed sandals

Dress Down Days

If you are able to go straight to the gym or yoga in your outfit, it would not be appropriate.

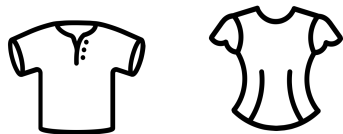
