

Insurance procedure

The following information has been relayed to every hospital in the country by the National Health Insurance House of Romania (CNAS). Its beneficiaries are the categories encompassed by OUG 15/2022 which grants free healthcare access (and more) to Ukrainian refugees¹

- I. The person needs to present themselves to the medical service providers with a valid border crossing document accepted by the Romanian state from which it can be understood that the person falls into the category of Ukrainian citizens or, as the case may be, foreign or stateless persons coming from the area of the armed conflict in Ukraine²
 - passports, travel documents, seaman's books or other similar documents issued, within the standards required by international practice, by the states, territories or international entities recognized by Romania;
 - refugee travel documents issued under the 1951 Geneva Convention relating to the Status of Refugees, and travel documents issued to foreigners who have been granted conditional humanitarian protection;
 - the travel documents of the stateless persons, issued by the states in which they have their domicile;
 - any existing medical documents, translated into Romanian.
- II. The medical service provider will scan and send the valid border document and the National Health Insurance House (CNAS) will release a Romanian personal identification number (CNP) and a CID (a code used to identify insured individuals in the electronic system).
- III. Following this step, the person should be fully insured by the Romanian state, with every healthcare expense being covered.
