ASSIGNMENTS AND COUNSELOR COMMUNICATION

What are the expectations of me while we are learning from home?

As far as we know, May 1st is still the deadline to enroll in most colleges, so while you are at home, you should be gathering all of the information you need in order to make your college decision. While school closures are not ideal, we want to make sure we are supporting you because you have been working so hard to prepare for this decision. Below are the assignments you should be working on! This is to ensure you are prepared to make a college decision and can stay on top of your grades before the end of the quarter.

*As a reminder, college financial aid offices and admission offices are still open and you can reach out via phone or email.

* You can see when grades will be entered for the following assignments. This is so you have some clarity around when you can see updates in PowerSchool and impacts on your GPA. That being said, we understand internet access might be intermittent so please complete assignments even after these due dates as grades will be updated periodically. You will not see grade penalties while we are on a school closure.

2 Counselor Check-Ins	15 pts per check in	Weekly every Friday	Sign up for a check in here . Your counselor will be sending emails and messages via Remind app to check in or set up check-ins. By responding to these messages and conducting check-ins you will earn these points. See below to set up Remind.
Decision Meeting (with parent/student counselor)	300 points	May 15	Sign up for a check in here. You should schedule a time to meet with your counselor over the phone to talk through your college options and next steps.
60% of Award Letters	300 pts	3/23	You should be collecting an award letter for EVERY college you were accepted to. While we are working from home, you can screenshot or email your award letters to your counselor for credit. Most award letters are found on your student portal, however, you may receive them through email or in the mail. You may also

			calculate the awards on the spreadsheet in google classroom. Grades will continue to be updated towards this benchmark, weekly on Mondays.

I'm still missing award letters from colleges. Where can I find them?

- On your STUDENT PORTAL. Most colleges send information about how to log into your student portal. On the portal, there is a financial aid section where you can find your award letter.
 - If your award letter is not on the student portal, you may still need to complete verification. You
 can find out if you are missing requirements in the portal. Usually the documents that you are
 missing can be found under "tasks" or "student requirements" section.

FINALIZING MY COLLEGE/POSTSECONDARY DECISION

What information do I need to make my post-secondary or college decision?

- 1. You should have all of your college decisions so that you know all of your options.
- 2. You should have **all of your award letters** so that you and your family can see the cost of each option and make an informed decision about financing your post secondary option.
- 3. You should be able to articulate HOW this college is the right fit for you by **giving a detailed answer to** the questions below:
 - o How will this college help you meet your future educational and career goals?
 - o Is this college financially sustainable for 4 years? How does it compare to other colleges?
 - o How will this college or post secondary program support you to successfully meet those goals?
 - o How will this college or post secondary program contribute to your overall joy and happiness?
 - o What are some challenges you might face specific to this college or post secondary plan? How will you plan to overcome those challenges?

What should I do if I think I'm ready to make a college or postsecondary choice?

- 1. Make sure you have completed all of the steps above.
- 2. You should **contact your college counselor** to talk through each step and question and then schedule a meeting with your family.

What if my parent has a question?

o You or your parent can contact your counselor to schedule a time to talk to your parent via email or the remind app.
