

## PROJECT BASED LEARNING - Day 6 – Awareness and Responsibility

SEPTEMBER 27, 2025

### Theme: Sustainability and Cyber Awareness for a Better Tomorrow

On the sixth day of the PBL at **GNIMS** continued its festive journey with a meaningful focus on **awareness, sustainability, and social responsibility**. The day's theme emphasized not only celebrating cultural vibrancy but also understanding our role in creating a conscious and responsible society.

#### Introduction and Felicitation:

The session began on an enthusiastic note with our confident anchor, **Mr. Tanmay Chaudhary**, an **MCA 1st-year student**, who welcomed the gathering with warmth and energy. He introduced the esteemed guest speaker, **Mr. Siddharth Nakai, Co-Founder of G.A.M.E (Greening Advertising Media Entertainment)** and invited **Mr. Siddharth**

to felicitate him as a gesture of appreciation and respect.

#### Session on Sustainability and E-Waste Awareness:

Mr. Siddharth Nakai, known for his innovative approach toward sustainability in the media and entertainment industry, addressed one of the most pressing global concerns — **E-Waste Management**. He began by drawing attention to the fact that **e-waste is one of the fastest-growing waste streams worldwide**, encompassing everything from discarded phones to chargers, and explained how it poses severe **environmental, human, and social challenges**.

He elaborated on **G.A.M.E's vision** of promoting **sustainability across media and entertainment**, showcasing how the industry can adopt responsible practices both **on set and on screen**, while also shaping **public perception** toward environmental consciousness.

Mr. Nakai shared a series of **practical and innovative sustainability solutions**, such as:

- Using the **Ryman Eco Font**, which saves up to **35% of ink** when printing.
- Switching to **bamboo tissues** as an eco-friendly substitute for paper tissues.
- Practicing **proper waste segregation** at home to enable recycling.
- Using **rechargeable batteries** instead of disposable ones to reduce plastic and chemical waste.

He also encouraged students to make **lifestyle choices** that reduce carbon footprints — adopting **mindful consumption**, considering **vegetarian diets**, and **donating or reusing items** to extend their lifecycle.

### **Purposeful Programming and Sustainable Mindsets:**

One of the most engaging parts of Mr. Nakai's talk was his concept of “**purposeful programming**” — subtly embedding sustainability messages into popular media and entertainment content. He cited the example of *Kaun Banega Crorepati (KBC)*, which incorporates sustainability themes such as **saving water** and **planting trees** through its dialogue and presentation.

By combining environmental awareness with storytelling, he demonstrated how media can be a powerful tool to inspire behavioral change, bridging the **environmental, social, and economic** aspects of sustainability. His message was clear — **change begins with awareness**, and every individual has a role to play in building a greener and cleaner planet.

### **Cyber Awareness Session by the Cyber Security Cell:**

The event further strengthened its focus on responsibility with an insightful session by **PSI Pravin Patil, Head of the Cyber Security Cell**, and **Constable Govind Shirgire**. Their discussion shed light on the **rising menace of cybercrime** and the importance of vigilance in the digital age.

Mr. Patil began by explaining **how online scams operate**, from **account cloning** to the misuse of personal data. He emphasized simple yet powerful safety measures such as: Enabling **two-step verification** on all digital accounts. Never sharing **OTPs or confidential information** online.

Recognizing fraudulent links and scam messages, especially those pretending to be **KYC updates, parcel delivery alerts, or fake job offers**.

The officers shared **real-life examples** of cyber frauds such as **parcel drug scams, investment traps, and discount phishing**, which resonated strongly with the audience. They also highlighted the official channels to report cybercrime:

The session ended with an interactive **Q&A**, where students discussed issues like **frozen bank accounts, safe password creation, and recovery of scammed funds**. The officers concluded with a powerful message — “*Don't think but take action!*” — emphasizing that immediate reporting and awareness can prevent greater harm.

Following the insightful sessions, **student representatives** shared their reflections.

## Conclusion:

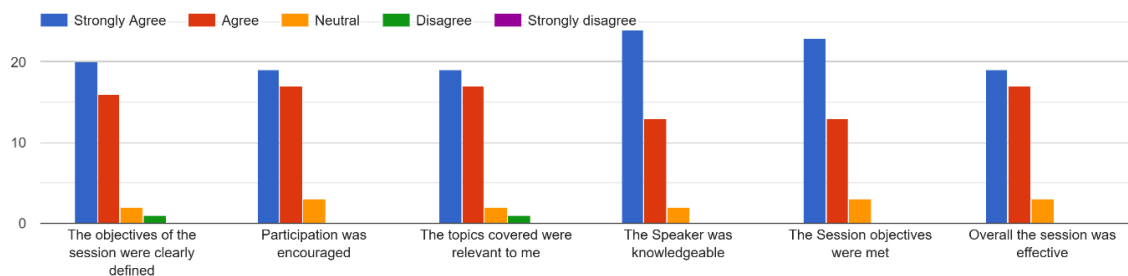

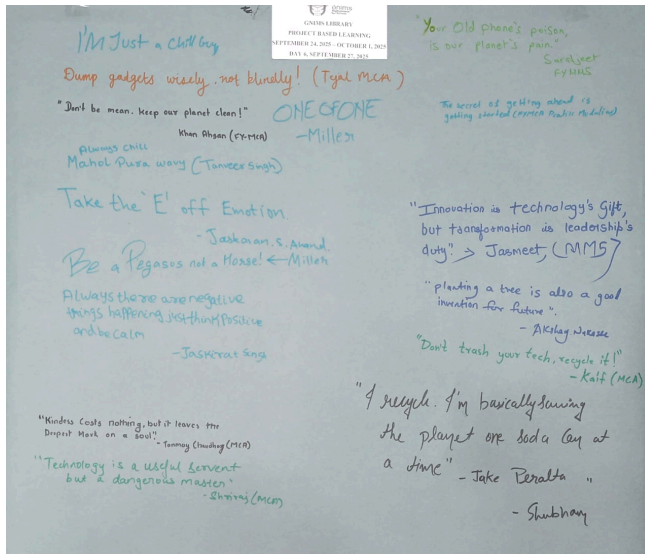
## Key Takeaways from the Session:
