CRIMES / INCIDENTS

Crimes recorded between 01/03/2025 and 31/03/2025.

North Queensferry – There were 3 crimes recorded during this period which relate to possession of a controlled substance, breach of the peace and police assault.

Inverkeithing – There were 29 crimes recorded during this period. Some crimes recorded relate to theft, assault, police assault and vandalism. There were 10 recorded crimes relating to road traffic offences included in this figure.

Dalgety Bay/Hillend – There were 10 crimes recorded during this period. The majority of crimes were for theft by shoplifting.

Aberdour – There were no crimes recorded during the month of March.

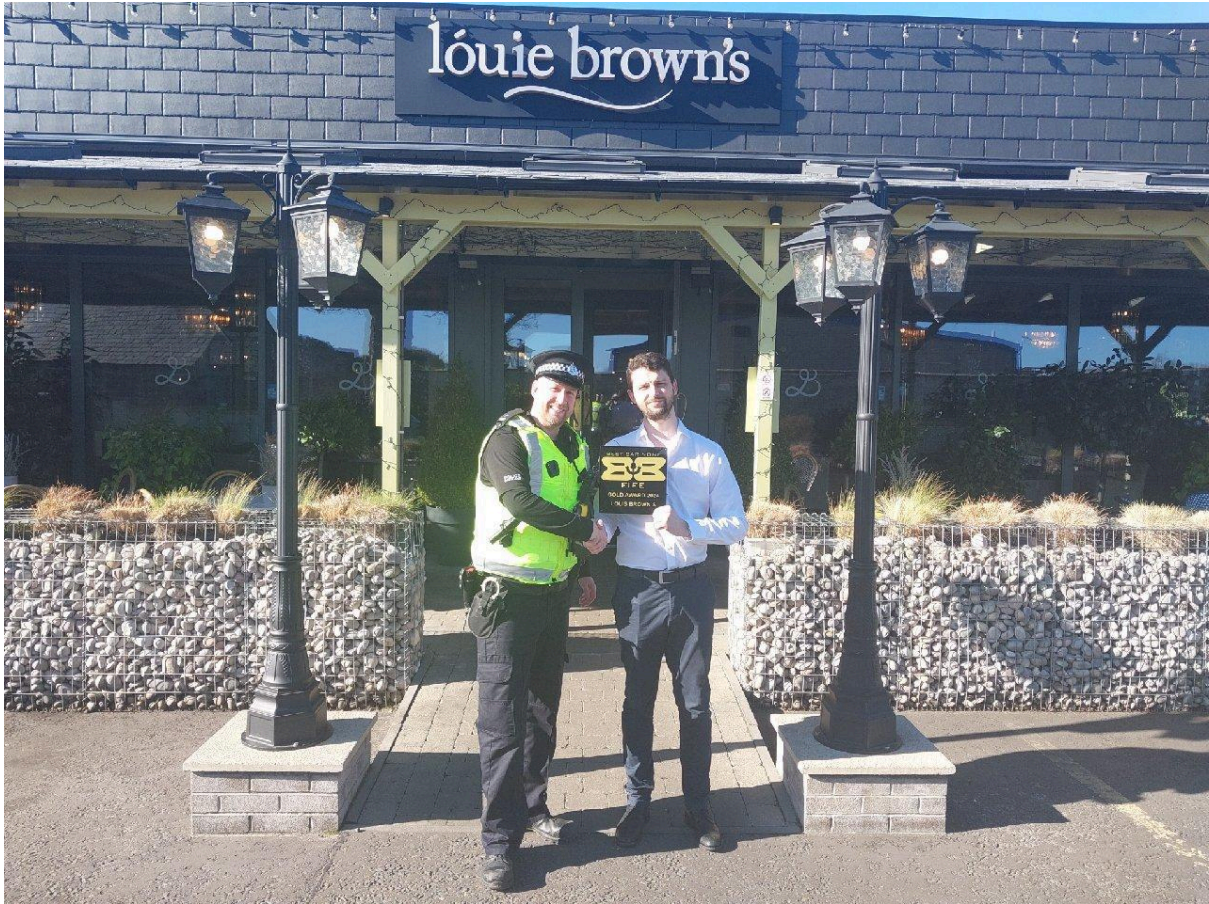

During the month of March PC Thomson and Kennedy have been abstracted to backfill response as well as attending essential training courses.

On 25th March, Ward Officers were delighted to award Louie Browns with the gold award they received at the “Best Bar None” awards. It should be noted that Hugo’s bar also received a gold award which was previously accepted at the awards ceremony.

Ward officers continue with their positive engagement with local primary schools having attended Dalgety Bay nursery to talk about “People that help” and positively engaged with P7 pupils at Donibristle Primary school regarding anti-social behaviour and the impact behaviour can have on the wider community. Ward officers have reached out to all primary schools in the ward area offering their services to conduct formal and informal inputs regarding relevant policing matters.

Whilst on duty PC's Thomson and Kennedy continue to patrol regular anti-social behaviour hotspots with an increase focus on Aberdour silver sands due to the lighter evenings.

Ward officers have been engaging with residents at North Queensferry regarding illegal parking and anti-social behaviour and will continue to patrol the area.
