Step 2: Find Ant Trail or Nest	<ul> <li>look for small piles of fine sawdust.</li> <li>Look for moist wood in wood piles, trees, gaps between boards etc</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Identify trail and track to source</li> <li>Sponge with soapy water to eliminate trail.</li> </ul>
Step 3: Destroy the Nest	Food Grade Diatomaceous Earth (DE):  - Tiny skeletal remains of algae-like plants. Lethal dust for insects.  - Important to get only food grade-DE which is safe around kids and pets  - Inject DE directly into the nest.	BORAX:  - Boric Acid. Poisonous! (1 teaspoon can kill a child!)  - Place homemade Borax ant bait at home entry points.  - 3 parts Powdered sugar, 1 part borax. place containers of mixture in the path of their trail  - ½ cup sugar and 3 tablespoons borax. Soak with cotton balls and place in shallow dishes near ant trails.  - Do not kill ants you see. Let them carry bait back to nest to kill entire colony  Protein and Grease Mix:  - Some ants like protein and grease. Mix a spoonful of peanut butter with 1 tablespoon of sugar and 1 teaspoon of borax.  - Using a plastic straw, tap the end into the mixture repeatedly until the straw is full of the mixture. Cut the

	straw into ½ inch pieces and place them next to ant trails.
Step 4: Prevention and control of future re-infestation	<ul> <li>White Vinegar:         <ul> <li>Spray vinegar near baseboards, cracks and counter tops. Let vinegar to dry to eliminate chemical trail.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Sanitation:         <ul> <li>Clean up and don't spill sugary foods.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Peppermint essential Oil             <ul> <li>Put a few drops of peppermint essential oil on a cotton ball and place in areas ants are crawling around.   - Carpenter Ants
    - Found in wooded areas. Do not carry bait back to nests.
    - Find Nest
      - look for small piles of fine sawdust.
      - Look for moist wood in wood piles, trees, gaps between boards etc
    - Removal

- Food Grade Diatomaceous Earth (DE): Tiny skeletal remains of algae-like plants. Lethal dust for insects. important to get only food grade-DE which is safe around kids and pets
- Inject DE directly into the nest.
- Odiferous House Ants:
  - Attracted to sweets. Leaves pheromone trails. If you kill the ants, other ants will still follow the trail. Entire colony must be killed.
  - Identify trail and track to source
  - Sponge with soapy water to eliminate trail.
  - Removal:
    - BORAX: Place homemade Borax ant bait at home entry points.
      - 3 parts Powdered sugar, 1 part borax. place containers of mixture in the path of their trail
      - ½ cup sugar and 3 tablespoons borax. Soak with cotton balls and place in shallow dishes near ant trails.
      - Do not kill ants you see. Let them carry bait back to nest to kill entire colony
    - Protein and Grease Mix:
      - Some ants like protein and grease. Mix a spoonful of peanut butter with 1 tablespoon of sugar and 1 teaspoon of borax.
      - Using a <u>plastic straw</u>, tap the end into the mixture repeatedly until the straw is full of the mixture. Cut the straw into ½ inch pieces and place them next to ant trails.
  - Control of future infestations:
    - White Vinegar: Spray vinegar near baseboards, cracks and counter tops. Let vinegar to dry to eliminate chemical trail.
    - Sanitation: Clean up and don't spill sugary foods.
    - Peppermint essential Oil
      - Put a few drops of peppermint essential oil on a cotton ball and place in areas ants are crawling around. (<u>find 100%</u> <u>pure essential oils here</u>)
    - Cinnamon
      - Sprinkle cinnamon (being careful not to get it on things that will stain) near entry points.
    - Baby Powder
      - Some ants dislike baby powder. Sprinkle around perimeter of house or indoors where ants are entering your house.
    - Vaseline
      - Rub a little <u>Vaseline</u> near the areas they are entering the house.

#### 13 Common Items for Getting Rid of Ants

- 1. Adhesive Tape
- 2. Basters Blow small amounts of borax into crevices
- 3. Chalk (Calcium carbonate) Draw a line around home entry points. Scatter around plants
- 4. Flour Sprinkle a line along pantry shelves and entry points. ants won't cross the line.
- 5. Flower Pot Good against fire ants. Place flowerpot upside down over ant hill and pour boiling water down drain hole.
- 6. Lemons Use the juice into holes, cracks. scatter small slices of peel around outdoor entrance. BONUS: cockroaches and fleas are also kept away. Mix 4 lemons with 2 liters of water and wash floors.
- 7. Oranges Make puree of few orange peels in 1 cup warm water. Pour solution over and into ant nests.
- 8. Cayenne Pepper Put pepper around sugar sources
- 9. Plastic Container with water Put legs of tables into plastic containers of water
- 10. Salt Ants will not cross salt.
- 11. Herbs and Spices Put a Bay Leaf, sage, stick cinnamon, white cloves inside cupboards and inside containers to discourage ants.
- 12. Talcum or Baby Powder Organic ant repellent sprinkle around entry points.
- 13. Mint Plant around house
- 14. Vinegar Equal parts water and vinegar and spray on areas with ants.

#### 7 Ways to get rid of Ants Naturally

- 1. Essential Oils
  - a. Peppermint
  - b. Tea Tree
  - c. Clove
  - d. Lemon or Orange
- 2. Ant Away Spray: ¼ water + ¼ vodka (used as solvent), 15 drops peppermint and 15 drops tea tree essential oil, 7 drops of citrus essential oil.
- 3. Food Grade Diatomaceous Earth
- 4. Vinegar:
- 5. Citrus Peel Spray: 1 part vinegar 1 part water. Put in citrus peels. Heat mixture till steaming then cool.
- 6. Dr Bronner's Soap Spray

- 7. Baking Soda and Powdered Sugar: 1 part baking soda and 1 part powdered sugar. Baking soda kills the ants.
- 8. Lemon Juice: Half lemon juice and half water OR 15 essential oil for every half cup.
