These classes can change depending on CCP course availability Courses are pre-selected in 9th and 10th grade to ensure students have completed the required High School credits before starting their Dual Enrollment courses in 11th grade.

*A change in the graduation requirements, Act 158 of 2018, establishes additional requirements for high school graduation, effective with the graduating class of 2022. The law creates multiple alternative pathways to graduation for students who are not proficient in the three Keystone Exams in Algebra I, Literature, and Biology.
