(Left-aligned, Cambria 14 pt, maximum 15 words. The first letter must be capitalized, and the rest in lowercase)

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Abstract

(11pt, Cambria). The abstract should be clear, concise, and descriptive. It should provide a brief introduction to the problem (preferably 1-2 sentences), the objective of paper, a short description of research method, and a brief summary of results. The abstract should end with a statement on the significance of the results or a brief conclusion. Abstracts must be written in 11 pt Cambria and preferably not more than 300 words.

Keywords:

(11pt, Cambria). Maximum of 5 keywords separated by semicolon (;), crucial to the appropriate indexing of the papers, are to be given. eg: Education; Islamic; Local Wisdom

A. INTRODUCTION/ المقدمة (.11pt, Cambria, bold/ Arabic Sakkal Majalla 16pt)

All papers submitted to the proceeding should be written in English, Arabic, or Bahasa Indonesia. Authors whose first language is not English are encouraged to have their manuscripts reviewed for grammar and clarity prior to submission. We hereby declare that the submitted article has been checked for originality and complies with the publication requirements. The similarity index, as verified through Turnitin plagiarism detection software, is 20%. . The Turnitin settings have been configured to exclude bibliographies and direct quotations. Furthermore, the use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) tools in assisting the preparation, writing, or editing of this manuscript is limited to 20%, as indicated by Turnitin, and is in accordance with ethical guidelines for AI-assisted research writing.

Manuscript should be typed using word processors (Microsoft Word or Open Office) software. The font used throughout the paper is Cambria 11pt. The paper size is A4 (i.e., 210 x 297 mm), one colume format with a 2.5 cm margin at the top, a 2.5 cm margin at the bottom, 2.5 cm margin on the left, and 2 cm margin on the right. The text should be one-and-a-half spaced and justified. Page numbers must be included in the footer section of each page. The use of personal pronouns such as "I" and "we" should be avoided. The number of pages must be between a minimum of 7 (seven) and a maximum of 10 (ten) pages, including tables, figures, and references.

Manuscripts submitted to this proceeding should follow the structure outlined below, except for the review article: *Title; Authors Name; Authors Affiliation; Abstract; Keywords; Introduction; Methods; Results and Discussion; Conclusions; Acknowledgments; and References.*

In the Introduction section, authors should state the objectives of the study at the end of the section. Prior to stating the objectives, authors should provide adequate background information and a brief literature review to identify existing solutions or

methods, highlight the best findings from previous research, present the main limitations of prior studies, explain the expected contribution or solution to those limitations, and demonstrate the scientific merit or novelty of the paper. Avoid providing an extensive literature review or a summary of results. The literature review should not be presented author by author, but rather grouped by method or topic, with references cited accordingly.

Example of novelty statement or the gap analysis statement in the end of Introduction section (after state of the art of previous research survey): “..... (short summary of background)..... A few researchers focused on There have been limited studies concerned on Therefore, this research intends to The objectives of this research are”.

B. METHODS/منهج البحث (11pt, Cambria, bold/ Arabic Sakkal Majalla 16pt)

In this section, authors are required to describe the research method, design, instruments, participants (subjects), and research location. Clearly present the research procedure to ensure readability and clarity. You should also explain how data were collected and analyzed. Make sure that the research method employed is appropriate to the research problem and objectives. The Methods section should enable readers to replicate the study. Provide sufficient detail to allow the work to be reproduced. Methods that have been previously published should be cited, and only relevant modifications need to be described. Do not repeat well-established procedures. For chemical materials, please specify the brand and purity (for example: CaO (Merck, 99.5%)).

C. RESULT & DISCUSSION/ نتائج البحث ومناقشتها (11pt, Cambria, bold/ Arabic Sakkal Majalla 16pt)

Results should be presented clearly and concisely. This section should summarize the scientific findings rather than providing raw data in excessive detail. Authors are encouraged to highlight the differences between their results and those of previous studies.

The Discussion should focus on the significance of the findings, rather than merely restating them. A combined Results and Discussion section is often appropriate. Avoid extensive citations and unnecessary repetition of published literature.

The Discussion is the most critical part of the paper, as it provides an opportunity to interpret and justify your results. Ensure that the discussion corresponds to the results but does not simply reiterate them. It should begin with a brief summary of the main scientific findings (not a restatement of experimental data). The discussion should address the following components: How do your results relate to the original questions or objectives outlined in the Introduction section (what)? Do you provide interpretation scientifically for each of your results or findings presented (why)? Are your results consistent with what other investigators have reported (what else)? Or are there any differences?

All figures and tables must be centered and numbered consecutively. Tables (refer with: Table 1, Table 2,...) should be presented above the table contain in center alignment. A descriptive title should be placed after table title (refer with: Table 1, table 2,...) above each table. The source of the table should be placed below the table in right alignment. Example:

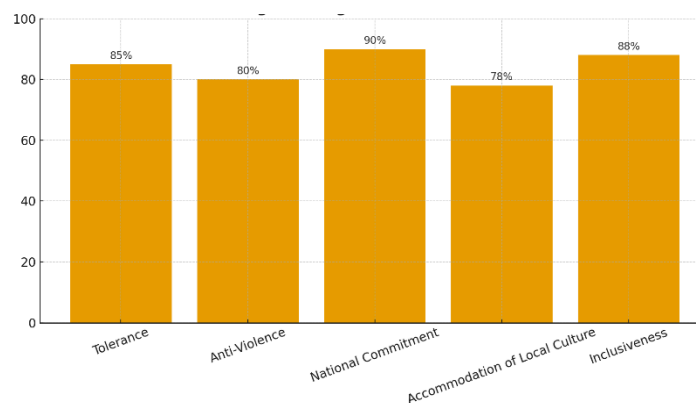


Figure 1. Religious Moderation Values

Figures (referred to as Figure 1, Figure 2, ...) should be placed below each illustration and accompanied by a descriptive caption. All figures must be of high resolution and clearly legible.

D. CONCLUSION/ الخاتمة (.11pt, Cambria, bold/ Arabic Sakkal Majalla 16pt)

The Conclusions should directly address the research objectives and clearly explain how the study advances the field beyond the current state of knowledge. Without a clear conclusion, reviewers and readers may find it difficult to assess the value and contribution of the work, as well as its suitability for publication. Avoid repeating the Abstract or merely listing experimental results. Provide a concise scientific justification for your findings, and indicate their possible applications or implications. Authors are also encouraged to suggest directions for future research or mention ongoing related studies.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS (optional)

Authors may acknowledge the assistance of colleagues, technical staff, or organizations that provided financial support. In addition, authors may recognize individuals who contributed to the research, such as those who offered language help, writing assistance, or proofreading. The Acknowledgments section should be unnumbered and written briefly.

REFERENCES/ قائمة المصادر (.11pt, Cambria, bold/ Arabic in Roman Script)

Cite only the main scientific publications that form the basis of your work, and ensure that all cited items have been personally read. Avoid including an excessive number of references, unnecessary self-citations, or multiple citations from the same region. Each reference must be carefully checked against the original source for accuracy, including the author's name, publication title, volume, issue, year, and DOI number. Authors are strongly encouraged to use reference management tools such as EndNote, Mendeley, or Zotero.

Write at least 15 recent references that are cited and actually written/quoted in the text from primary sources (80% taken from scientific journals, 20% from other

supporting sources). All publications cited in the text should be included as a list of references. References are sequentially numbered as they appear in the text. Please ensure that every reference cited in the text is also present in the reference list (and vice versa). Any references cited in the abstract must be given in full. Unpublished results and personal communications are not recommended in the reference list, but may be mentioned in the text. If these references are included in the reference list they should follow the standard reference style of the journal and should include a substitution of the publication date with either “Unpublished results” or “Personal communication”. Citation of a reference as 'in press' implies that the item has been accepted for publication. Recommendations for references for this proceeding are **APA 7 Edition Style**.
