Classroom Expectations

We want to make the band the best it can be, and we use our class time wisely. These rules will be followed in band so everyone will benefit from our class:

- The band works together as a team to create music we are like a family! Students will be respectful and remain positive throughout the learning process. We will all help each other and support each other when mistakes are made.
- Always raise your hand to ask permission to talk. You miss what is taught and so
 do the people around you if you are talking.
- Do not play your instrument without permission during rehearsal; that is a distraction for you and those around you.
- Be on time to all lessons, rehearsals, and performances.
- It is expected that every student will be at every rehearsal and performance.
 Students who are well enough to attend school during the day are well enough to attend concerts after school. We count on each other to make music together.
- Students should bring their instrument, music, folder, and a pencil to lessons and rehearsals.
- Even if a student does not have an instrument/music, that student is still expected to come to their lesson. It is important that we know where the student is so that we can discuss what they will need to practice at home.
- Gum, candy, food, and soda are not permitted in the band room. A water bottle is welcome!

On **Wednesdays**, band students will attend AE (Academic Enrichment) in place of their regular band class. Chorus students will meet during those periods. Any student who participates in both band and chorus will not attend an AE class.

Jazz Band is an extracurricular class that students may choose to participate in. See below for more information.

Technique Class is a crucial part of the middle school band curriculum (see page 8 for more detailed information). The following page lists the days on which specific groups will attend band for their Technique Class. Please remember that this will operate on a six week long rotating schedule, consisting of periods 2, 3, 4, 8, 9, and 10.

6th, 7th, & 8th Grade Band

Students attend band class on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays (see above schedule). During these rehearsals, students work on developing ensemble skills, such as following a conductor, cross-section listening, group dynamics/articulations, and musicality. These band rehearsals are essential for preparing students for their performances throughout the school year.

Technique Class Lessons

In conjunction with the daily rehearsal, the District 424 music curriculum provides an opportunity for instrumental music students to have Technique Classes during their school day. These classes are essential for a middle school curriculum, as they allow for small group instruction that addresses instrument-specific skills. Students will be excused from one class period per week on a rotating schedule. For attendance and safety purposes, students are required to check in with their classroom teacher prior to leaving to attend band. These classes will rotate on a six week schedule (see above schedule). The class period will change weekly, but the day of the week will remain the same. Weekly schedules are posted outside of the band room and in each grade level hallway.

Jazz Band

Jazz Band is designed for 7th and 8th grade students wishing to broaden their musical development and participation. Membership for this extra-curricular ensemble is based upon student desire, musical ability, and instrumentation needs. Rehearsal times are 7:00 a.m. - 7:45 a.m. on Tuesday and Thursday mornings. Students should arrive at 6:45 a.m. in order for rehearsals to start promptly. Participation in the Jazz Band is optional and all performances are mandatory (please check the performance dates prior to signing up).

Equipment Information

Students should be respectful towards instruments: their own and others. If an instrument does not belong to a student, that student should not be touching it. Students should take care when walking around in lessons or rehearsal so as to not accidentally "nudge" other instruments on the ground or on chairs.

Tips for keeping your instrument in good condition:

All procedures and supplies as prescribed above for maintenance and care are the same for school owned instruments.

Practicing

Students are encouraged to practice their instruments at least five days a week. A good rule of thumb is to practice any day that ends in a "y". Singing can be fatiguing due to lack of muscle development, so starting with a few minutes of practice is fine for beginning students.

Here are some practice guidelines:

Level of Experience	Fall	Spring
5th Grade or Beginner	10 min/week	15 min/week
6th Grade	15 min/week	25 min/week
7th Grade	30 min/week	40 min/week
8th Grade	60 min/week	60 min/week

Frequent, small practice sessions are more beneficial than one long session.

Students will not have a practice log to fill out, because we don't believe they help develop good practice habits. Students will be expected to practice however long as they feel will prepare them for their next lesson, or upcoming concert. We will know when a student is unprepared for a lesson and we will discuss solutions to help be more prepared for the next lesson.

There is no rule that a student MUST practice a certain number of minutes per week. Students need to practice so that they are comfortable singing, and so that they can stay together with their section within the chorus.

Concert Attire

All students should have the following for performances:

- White dress shirt
- Black pants
 - No jeans, shorts, skirts, or leggings.
- Black socks
 - Must be long enough so the ankles can not be seen when seated.
- Black shoes
 - Shoes must be 100% BLACK, there are no exceptions.
 - No flip-flops or open-toed shoes.



Grading Policy

Band grades will consist of the following:

- Tests & Concert Attendance = 80%
 - Written and performance assessments
 - Students are required to attend ALL of the concerts in which they are performing throughout the year
- Participation and additional homework assignments = 20%
 - Includes bringing all necessary materials to class
 - Instrument
 - Cleaning supplies, reeds, percussion stick bag, etc.
 - Music and method book
 - Pencil

Weekly participation grades will consist of the following:

- 4 points for Band Rehearsals
 - o One point per day (Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday)
 - Students must bring their instrument to class in order to receive their daily point
 - Points will be adjusted accordingly if a student is absent from school on a Band Rehearsal day
- 2 points for Technique Class Lesson
 - One point for attendance and participation
 - One point for bringing their instrument

Should a student miss their Technique Class Lesson, they will be able to make up the points by submitting a five minute long recording of them practicing their instrument at home. This can be submitted via Google Classroom using Screencastify. Students can also submit videos this way to make up points for days that they forgot to bring their instrument to class.

Parent/Guardian Involvement

As parents/guardians, your active involvement is one of the cornerstones of an excellent band program. You play a pivotal role in nurturing students' musical growth. Your support enhances practice routines, reinforces learning at home, and fosters a sense of community within the band. By collaborating closely, we can create an environment where students thrive and achieve their full potential, resulting in a rewarding and enriching musical journey.

The band program utilizes *Rooms* in order to communicate announcements and stay in touch with families. If you have a cell phone or smart device, please make sure to download the *GK Cogs App* in order to stay in touch.

Private Lessons

It is impossible to overemphasize the positive impact of private lessons. Individual instruction is the best way to help students fulfill their potential. The main benefit of a private lesson is weekly one on one instruction with an expert on your particular instrument. A private instructor will immediately reinforce strengths and give specific instruction for improvement. Please request our recommended list of private instructors if this is an advantage you wish to offer your child.
