Issues for us:

- **Online training modules will replace clinics with instructors - how do we handle the myriad of questions that arise within a clinic?**
 - Offer a Zoom where an instructor is there while people do the training module and they can ask questions?
- **All referees are now the same**
 - Going forward, to become a ref, you will have to be an AO first.
 - We will need to contact those who were DR before and offer a chance to take an AO clinic and get some table experience. This cannot be required, they are simply being grandfathered and are eligible to run a meet
 - Is there a way for us to help teams understand the importance of selecting a MR who has the experience to handle a situation that is unexpected?
- **Testing/clinic (the test will be in the training module) required every 3 years.**
- **For most positions, the official must work 8 sessions in three years to re-certify. It is more for Ref.....when we get final document we can go over the numbers.**
- **Trainers will need to be selected carefully by the referee - if you don't have someone who is experienced enough to train, just say you can't accommodate a trainee.**
- **The trainer will have to fill out a form and the trainer and ref both sign off. This happens at each of the 4 sessions and then the forms are sent to the certifiers (co-chairs) for review.**
- **Training is 4 sessions for most positions. Time between becoming certified and being eligible to move up has been shortened. Again, we are waiting for final document before posting specific numbers.**
