Overview

Demand transparency and public insight into the development of the City of Houston's annual operating budget.

When: Held annually in the lead-up to the city's budget adoption, typically during the spring and early summer months.

Purpose:

- Learn about department-level budget proposals and anticipated service levels
- Demand community input to ask questions, and suggest adjustments
- To engage in the city's financial planning process and persuade them to make changes
- To ensure fiscal responsibility and alignment of resources with community needs and goals

Give a Public Comment

Attend a City Council Meeting to give public comment at City Hall: 901 Bagby, Second Floor Houston, TX 77002.

City Council meetings are conducted each week on Tuesdays at 1:30 p.m. and Wednesdays beginning at 9:00 a.m. Any citizen may speak before Council on Tuesdays beginning at 2:00 p.m. To reserve time to address the City Council in person (**between one and three minutes**), contact the Office of the City of Houston Secretary by 3:00 p.m. by Monday prior to the scheduled public session shown on the agenda. All Council meetings are open to the public. Your name will be called when it is your turn to speak. Bring your ID and be prepared to go through a metal detector.
