

90 cents per year annually is spent on walking and cycling infrastructure by the Australian Federal Government.

From 2008-2028, a total of \$384 million has been funded by the Federal Government for the following active transport investments:

- \$40 million for [cycling infrastructure in 2008](#)
- An estimated \$60 million in the 2018 Perth City Deal for the [Boorloo Bridge](#) and [CBD transport plan](#)
- \$144 million for the [Kangaroo Point Bridge](#) in Brisbane
- An estimated \$40 million as part of the [Pinch Points program](#) in 2020 for Oxford Street and Doncaster Avenue in Sydney's east.
- \$100 million for the national [Active Transport Fund](#), announced in 2024, allocated over four years 2025 to 2028 (90 cents/ person annually).
