

## NOVA All Access FOIA Request – 05/16/25

- number of students that are paying *NOVA All Access fees* for OER classes
  - Answer is in Question 3 in the Chancellor’s Memo
- exactly the amount of students that are saving money
  - Answer is in Question 4 in the Chancellor’s Memo
- what combination of classes they took in order to save money
  - This is student enrollment dependent. Any student who is taking more than one course has access to the “All Access Calculator” through their student email log-in to determine whether the All Access program will save them money

  - Any student who takes all OER courses (\$0 materials) is advised to opt-out of the program.
- who is calculating these numbers and exactly how they calculated it
  - Barnes & Noble calculates these numbers based on a combination of student enrollment data provided by the college, materials’ information based on faculty adoptions, and materials’ cost data (current retail pricing) obtained by Barnes and Noble.
- amount of students enrolled in All Access,
  - Fall 2024 – 34,173
  - Spring 2025 - 31,632
- the exact amount that students have paid versus what they would have paid without All Access?
  - Answer is in Question 1 in the Chancellor’s Memo
