Abstract

Abstract are written in 2 languages (English and Indonesian), in 1 paragraph, distance of 1 point, and abstract lengths between 100-200 words. The purpose of abstract writing is to provide an overview to the reader about the contents of all articles which include; problem research, research methods and important results of research. In addition, abstract abstract writing must also be able to help the reader to read all or download the article.

Keywords: *Consists of 3-6 Words, Italic, Each Word is Separated by Comma (,)*

Introduction

Convey the problem's context, the significance of the research, and the problem statement, backed up by facts/data, information, and phenomena. Remember to include previous research relevant to your research (recommended at least 5 previous studies). Based on the previous research presented in the previous paragraph, review your research position/research gap. Restate the purpose of your research and its contribution and significance.

Method

Method consists of description of research type, data collection, data source, data type, and data analysis. It is written in a paragraph form and explain operationally.

Result and Discussion

Result

Inform a number of important data (original) field which obtained from the questionnaires, surveys, documents, interviews, observations and other data collection techniques. It can be completed with table or graphic to clarify the result.

All figures and tables should be centered and numbered consecutively. Tables (refer with: Table 1, Table 2, ...) should be presented above the table contain in center alignment. A

descriptive title should be placed after table title (refer with: Table 1, table 2, ...) above each table. The source of the table should be placed below the table in right alignment. Example:

Equations (refer with: Eq.1, Eq.2, ...) should be presented in the right side of the equation and in the bracket (Eq.1). There should be one line of space above the equation and one line of space below it before the text continues. Example:

Discussion

Presenting the data that has been interpreted and analyzed by a specific technique and has been processed by the specific theory (also from researcher idea). **Citations in Text use *Chicago Manual of Style 17th Edition (full note)* (Mendeley/Zotero/endnote).**

Conclusion

Conclusion is not a summary. Do not repeat the abstract! Explain the main finding of your research, contribution, and implication. Explain the lack of your research so that you also mention the recommendation for further work. Do not write in point but in paragraphs, around 300 – 500 words (What was learned? What remains to be learned? (Directions for future research?). The limitations of what was done (evaluation). The benefits, advantages, applications, etc. of the research (evaluation). Recommendations and contribution.)

Acknowledgment (optional)

List individuals and or institutions who provided help during the research (e.g., providing grants, laboratory facility, language help, proofreading the article, etc.). In the case of the grants, please provide the year of the grant received.

References

References heading should be left justified, bold, with the first letter capitalized without number. *Chicago Manual of Style 17th Edition (fullnote)* reference style is required in this journal. References should be written using standard citation applications. The Tribakti: Jurnal Pemikiran Keislaman uses the **Zotero or Mendeley Reference Management Software in writing Citations and References**. At least 70% of references should be cited from up-to-date journals (international reputation journals) published in the last 8-10 years, but the rest of 30% of references can be cited from research reports, and or articles. The minimum number of reference lists is 50 references.
