



Hunt through the Growing Up WILD Activity Guide

First, walk the educators through the layout of the activity guide, before moving into the quiz portion for prizes. You do not need to cover every single section of the guide but highlight the more beneficial sections. While doing the overview of the guide, make sure to point out any sections, indices, or appendices that you plan to ask questions about during the review quiz.

GUIDE OVERVIEW

Page 4-5: Table of Contents; Activities arranged in a general progression beginning with those featuring simple concepts/skills to more complex ones. 27 total activities but there are several different types of experiences within each activity.

Page 6-13: Introduction; Good information but you don't need to cover it all. Highlight some valuable resources such as DAPs, assessing learning, responsible collecting, and WILD about safety.

Page 14-17: Activity format; Go through the layout of the activities and different features.

Page 18-191: Activities; First two pages are the main activity, and second two pages are supplemental experiences that support the topic.

Page 130-190: "Copy Me" pages for activities; These are also available to print as pdfs on the website.

Page 191-209: Home connections; Take home resources to continue their learning at home.

Page 210-213: State symbols across the US

Page 214 - 229: Children's book list; Supplemental books for the activities. Each activity list suggested book in the resources section of the sidebar.

Page 237: Expanded Index; Lists of activities that focus on specific topics

Page 230-236: Head Start and NAEYC correlations

Page 238-241: Glossary

Page 242-243: Incorporating wildlife into holiday celebrations

Page 244: Tips for Teachers; Inspiration and reminders for nature exploration

Page 248: Alphabetical Listing; Activities listed in alphabetical order for easy reference
