

## Bio

Christine Harrison is a visual artist living in Tillamook, Oregon. She is a painter, printmaker and sculptor. Harrison started using botanical dye prints in her work in 2018 and continues to learn from the active expanding community of textile and fine artists.

Fifteen new works by Harrison were showcased March - May 2023 in *In the Spirit of Nature* exhibition at Umpqua Art Center Roseberg, OR. Her work has been part of juried and group showings national and internationally. Her work is in private and corporate collections.

Harrison has been awarded residencies in Johnston, VT, Venice, Italy, and Remarque Print Workshop, Albuquerque, N.M. In 2013, Harrison received the Oregon Coast Art Council Mid-career Artist Award and exhibit in Newport, Oregon. Three permanent community cow sculptures, a joint venture with artist, Heidi Clemens and the Ford Family Foundation Leadership Candidates of 2010 are located at three prominent sites in Tillamook County.

Harrison is a founding member of Art Accelerated, a non-profit artist based organization promoting the arts and arts education in Tillamook County, Oregon.

Harrison originates from Oakland, California. She received a BA in painting from San Francisco State University and an MFA from California College of the Arts in Oakland, California.

Harrison currently teaches online community art courses with Art Accelerated and in person workshops at Hoffman Center for the Arts, Manzanita, OR. She taught visual art courses at Tillamook Bay Community College for eighteen years and graduate art education courses for Lesley University, Cambridge, MA.
