Dan Foran

Dan was a two-sport athlete at Waldwick, participating in football and basketball. On the gridiron, Dan was the starting quarterback during both his junior and senior seasons. As an 11th grader, Dan led the Warriors to a 6-3 record and received all-league and all-suburban honors. As a senior, the team was 7-2 and Dan again received accolades from the league and county. His play and leadership attracted college scouts and Dan received multiple scholarship offers, most notably from Temple University.

In the winter, the Warrior basketball team excelled during Dan's career. Pete Muir's team amassed a 22-4 record, captured a BPSL Conference title and the North 1 Group 2 Sectional championship. Waldwick High School was ranked #1 in the All-Suburban poll. Senior year, Dan continued his superior play. The team finished 18-4 with another BPSL crown and an appearance in the sectional finals. Dan ended his career with first Team All-County, All-League (BPSL), All-Area, All-Suburban, 2nd Team All State Group 2 and a Bergen County All Star as well as runner-up Area Player of the Year. Dan had several college offers before taking his talents to Hartwick College in New York.

A 4-year starter with a record of 127-18, Hartwick was in the top 20 nationally for D2 and advanced to the NCAA tournament multiple times. Dan played in the NCAA Tournament, Eastern Regionals, and NCAA Sweet 16 on several occasions. He was First Team All-Tournament for Hartwick Invitational twice and selected to the ECAC All-Star Weekly Team. During senior year, Dan was ranked 5th in the nation for field goal percentage (62%) and 5th in the nation for free throw percentage (91%).

Dan graduated in 1979 as one of Hartwick greatest players of all time.
