

Which volcanoes can you find?

1. Open a new google chrome window so you can read these instructions as you work on google maps.
2. In google chrome, on the top right of your page, click the **grid symbol**: 
3. Open '**google maps**'
4. On the top left of your page, click the **3 horizontal lines**: 
5. Click '**my maps**'
6. At the bottom of the box that appears, click '**create map**'
7. Click where it says '**Untitled map**' to give it the name **Volcanoes of the World**.
8. In the description box, **write a sentence** explaining that we are going to pin volcanoes we come across during the next term on this map.
9. Click '**OK**'.
10. In the **search bar**, search the volcano you are wanting to find e.g. **Mount Wellington**.
11. To enter a new pin, click the **balloon-shaped symbol** under the search bar.
12. A small plus will appear. **Click the plus onto the volcano** you are wanting to pin.
13. For each pin, **write one fact you have learned about this volcano**.

Need some more help?

1. Open the template map: [Volcanoes of the World](#). On this template, enter 'Mt Wellington' in the google maps search bar. Find the pin which I have dropped!

Note: Make sure you are pinning the volcano you are wanting! For example, when I searched Mt Wellington, it first took me to a Mt Wellington located in Australia!
