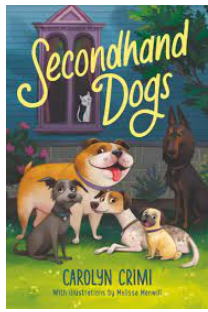

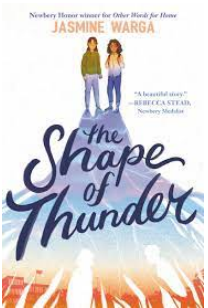


Voyage of the Sparrowhawk
