5. GUEST SPEAKER: FRED MEYER WITH BACKYARD ABUNDANCE
- a. Nature explore playscapes
 - b. Educational playscapes
 - i. About backyard abundance
 - ii. Local playscapes, nature explore
 - iii. Importance of children in nature
 - c. Vision: local non-profit, beautiful, resilient, etc. Urban spaces can support us better than they do now and also support wildlife habitat.
 - d. Yard tours, workshops, presentations, landscape designs
 - e. Nature deficit disorder- "direct exposure to nature is essential for the physical and emotional health of children and adults." From Richard Louv's Last Child in the Woods
 - f. Willowwind Prairie- Bio retention cell in front. Children based curriculum on the seeds that are planted and where they would best be suited within the cell. Passion for learning involved.
 - g. Wetherby Park- edible forest maze- mimics a healthy woodland- fruit trees, berries, perennials that will feed us, attract insects and support birds.
 - h. Recreation center division garden- fruit trees, plum shrubs, currants, etc... go out and find perennial food. Created outdoor classroom. Space where kids can learn. Maharishi School in Fairfield (see sep. handout): Wanted an outdoor classroom and a food forest.
 - i. The Woodlands: Forest habitat, observation, drawing

- ii. Sparkling springs: underground rain barrel fed from roof rain water, water conservation
 - iii. Hummingbird cottage: made of cob: sand, clay and straw. Has a living roof: sedum on one side and strawberries on the other side.
 - i. Nature explore is a program developed between the Arbor Day foundation and the dimensions education research foundation. Design principles are wrapped up in a book. Each space as a specific use to invoke a type of learning.
 - j. Existing playgrounds have a threshold for levels of activity. Kids can eventually become bored. The natural playspaces have unlimited uses and creative outlets.
 - k. Children and nature have been studied. Observation and creativity go up when children spend more time outside. Improved concentration. The more time outside, the greater the benefits. They heighten the same skills they learn in the classroom when out in nature.
 - l. Backyard abundance and abundant playscapes have partnered to do research in Johnson County. Every family had different goals. Kids have a strong hand in the plan/design. Many playscapes grow food. Kids are also involved in the construction. Teach why we are doing this. Support wildlife, families learning together, role models, help and observation opportunities.
 - m. Nature is our greatest teacher.
 - n. Funding: There are many resources to provide funding for these types of projects, but having a budget in mind is also helpful. Part of our make a mighty difference will be our starting point for this project.
