• Found Objects Color Wheel- Make a color wheel or circle with objects found at home. Start with primary colors: red, yellow, blue. Add secondary colored objects: orange, green, purple. (Secondary colors are made after mixing two primary colors.) Put orange between red and yellow objects. Put green between yellow and blue objects. Put purple or violet in between red and blue objects. You should have a circle of items in this order: red, orange, yellow, green, blue, purple, and back to red again.
