
Self Betterment

Effective time management techniques are the Promodo Technique - Focused work periods with scheduled breaks, Time Blocking- Setting aside specific blocks of time for particular tasks, Eisenhower Matrix- Prioritizing tasks based on urgency and importance, The Two-Minute Rule- Completing tasks that take less than two minutes immediately to avoid mental clutter, and Task Batching- Grouping similar tasks to reduce transition time.
