Active Minds launched a <u>campus climate survey</u> on March 21st to gauge student attitudes and well-being surrounding mental health. The survey will remain open until April 15th and a full data report is expected mid-May. Questions pertain to student satisfaction and experience with resources on campus, as well as attitudes towards mental health within their college.
