

Lesson 6: Legacy Builders (Ages:1-3)

Topic: 6.4 Job- The Father Who Trust in God

Objective: At the end of the lesson, children will:

- Know that Job loved and trusted God.
- Understand that bad things can happen, but God is always with us.
- Just like Job, a father can trust God.”

Welcome Time: Greet and welcome the children to class. Engage children in free play or engage them in games in relation to the lesson of the day.

Memory verse: Proverbs 3:5a

“Trust in the Lord with all your heart.” .

Say it with motions:

- "Trust" (hands together like praying)
- "in the Lord" (point up)
- "with all your heart" (hands over heart)

Bible Story/ Teaching Time: Job 1-2

Scripture: Job 1–2 (Tell it simply and visually)



Job was a very wealthy man.
He had lots of animals, land, and people who worked for Him.
He also had a big family. He loved his family very much.
Most of all, Job loved God with all of his heart.

One day, Satan told God that Job only loved Him because God gave him lots of things.

God knew this was not true. God allowed Job to lose everything.

Job was very sad. He ripped his clothes and shaved his hair to show he was very sad.

Job was sad, but He still loved God.

Next, God allowed Job to get very sick.

His skin was covered with boils.

He was in a lot of pain. He didn't understand why this was happening, but He still loved God.

His wife and friends told Job it was all his fault and to do bad things.

Job didn't listen. Job praised God.

Job learned that everything belongs to God.

God gave everything back to Job and more.

Job loved God more than anything else.

Job loved God because God is amazing, gracious, wise, and loving.

Application Time – Let's Talk:

Show some toy animals, food, or toy house pieces.

Ask the children what things make them happy.

Then gently say: *“These things are nice, but even if we don’t have them, we can still say, ‘Thank You, God!’ because God is always with us.”*

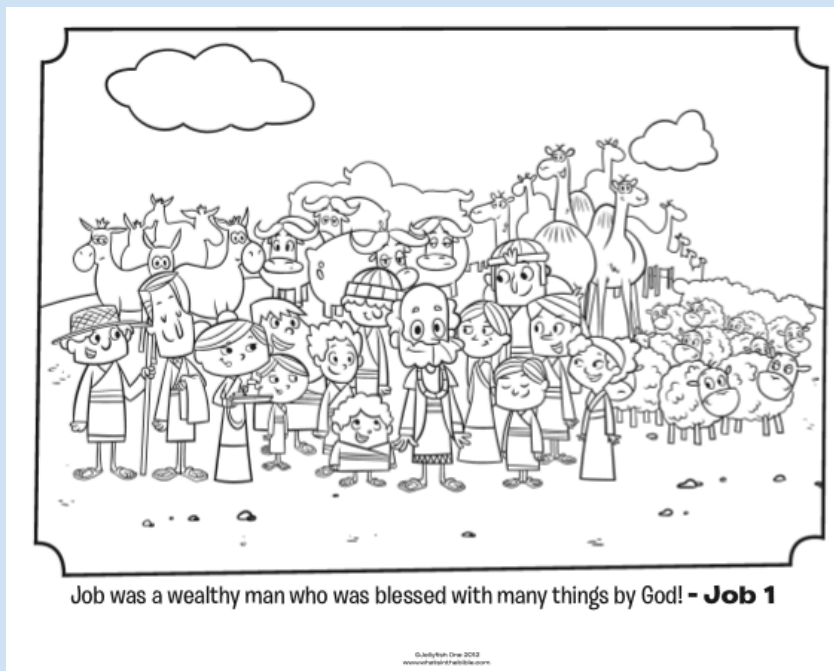
Explain: *“Just like Job, a father can love and trust God, even when things go wrong. That’s what makes a strong daddy—a Legacy Builder!”*

Discussions Questions:

Ask and Repeat:

- *Can we trust God when we are happy? (Yes!)*
- *Can we trust God when we are sad? (Yes!)*
- *Did Job trust God? (Yes!)*

Games and Activities





Simple Math

Collect any object that you may have around. Toys, Fruit, Sweets, Crayons all work great.

Have your children count the objects. You can then add some more objects or remove some.

Have your children count them again.

Ask your child if there are now more or less objects in the pile.

You can tweak this activity to your child's ability.
