

Hello ALL Christmas Revels Performers, Volunteers, Production Staff, Office Staff, Enthusiasts

This document explains the procedures in place for Covid safety during rehearsals and performances of Christmas Revels 2022.

It continues to be Washington Revels' policy that all participants in Revels' activities are vaccinated against Covid 19, including at least one booster if applicable.

Policy for masking during rehearsals

All indoor rehearsals will remain masked until tech week at Lisner Auditorium.

During select rehearsals, an individual may remove their mask for the purpose of articulation, volume, soloing or otherwise communicating with the rest of the group.

Masks may be removed for eating, drinking, or when outside.

COVID testing and reporting requirements for PERFORMERS

- Each Revels performer who will be unmasked onstage will be given three rapid tests to be taken prior to coming to Lisner Auditorium.
 - Tests will be taken on these dates:
 - Tuesday December 6
 - Friday December 9
 - Friday December 16
- Tests for 12/6 and 12/9 will be distributed at the 12/4 rehearsal.

- After the show closes December 18, we recommend everyone take one more rapid test for your own peace of mind and for those of your families as you navigate the holiday season.

Protocol for performing unmasked in Christmas Revels 2022

All non-performers will remain masked at all times while at Lisner Auditorium.

No performer will remove their mask unless directed to do so by one of the artistic team.

All performers must be masked when backstage, except:

- when applying makeup or dressing such that the mask inhibits dressing.
- When eating or drinking, and only long enough to eat or drink.

No performer will be required to remove their mask if they do not feel comfortable doing so.

When singing in the audience, other than in an active cross to the stage, performers should wear a mask.

Performers must find a way to keep the mask on or near their person, such that they can re-mask as necessary, or have a place immediately offstage to remask on exiting.

Once exiting the stage as defined above, performers should replace their mask.

Any mask worn onstage should be a **black** N95 or N94 mask – Revels will provide masks as necessary.

Protocol and Policy for Revels' Non-performing staff and volunteers

All backstage staff and volunteers must remain masked at all times inside Lisner except when eating or drinking or when communication requires removal of the mask.

Backstage staff in close proximity to the stage should wear a **black** mask.

Non-performers will **not** be required to submit a Covid test to be onsite.

Lisner Auditorium Policy

At this time, Lisner Auditorium **does not** require its audience to wear masks, nor does it have a vaccination check.

Revels will ask that all Lisner backstage personnel remain masked.

Revels volunteers will be asked to remain masked at all times.
