As a student, I recognise my fellow students' right to conduct peaceful protests especially considering this university's role in the genocide of the Palestinian people. It continuously breaches its own ethical investment and research policy by conducting research contracts with arms companies, as well as repeatedly encouraging its own students to work for these profiteers of war.

I implore the University of Liverpool to uphold the same moral and ethical values these students have courageously demonstrated and am appalled by the mistreatment endured by them throughout their journey fighting for what is right. I firmly stand against the use of force on students peacefully protesting and the use of police force and intimidation as an attempt to silence them. Additionally, I stand with my fellow students, and I oppose any threats, disciplinary or otherwise, made towards them for exercising their rights.

Most recently, students were unjustly asked to disassemble their encampment or face disciplinary action, a clear violation of our rights with no legal basis.

I urge you to reconsider your attitude towards the students occupying Alareer Square, and respect the rights of students to protest on our university campus.
