The Spinner's Book of Yarn Designs Book Study

Part 1: Back to the Basics Chapters 1-3: January-April 2024

Welcome to the Wool n' Spinning two-year book study of *The Spinner's Book of Yarns* by Sarah Anderson. This syllabus is to help you know what to expect from the Wool n' Spinning team during this season, so you can plan how you want to engage with the study. Your feedback is welcome; please let us know if you have any questions, or if you find this helpful.

Tracks

You can engage with the book however you want, at whatever depth you want. However, if you find structure helpful, I've made suggestions for how you can participate in this study with your own spinning.

Track 1: Samples

Make a selection of samples for your own learning and records.

Materials: Any commercial wool top, 5-10 oz. For the simplest, most accessible option, choose a medium wool like Corriedale, in white or a light, easy-to-see solid colour.

Sample cards. E.g. index cards, dry cleaning labels, cut cardstock.

A way to store your samples: Sample card sleeves, cardstock binder pages, a journal, etc. These options will be discussed; no need to choose in advance.

A suggested list of samples to spin can be found on page 3, which is your customized schedule.

Track 2: Single Project

Dig deeper into some aspects of these chapters with a larger project over several months.

Materials: Fiber for a single project, of a realistic amount for you to complete within a few months. If you wanted to do a capstone project for the Year of Colour but didn't have a chance, this would be a great choice. You could also work from your stash, or not! Choose a yarn structure from chapters 1-3 of the book.

A suggested timeline for the project can be found on page 4, which is your customized schedule.

Track 3: Choose your own Adventure

On page 5, we have included a schedule with the "assignments" area blank, so you can make your own plan, or skip the planning and use that page to record your explorations as you follow your own path.
