Adjectives	first, hardest, early
Rhyming Words	gold-hold, flower-hour, leaf-grief, day-stay, first-hardest, early-only, dawn-down

Sparkling, flashing, ever moving,

A poem lovely as a tree.

A tree whose hungry mouth is prest
Against the earth's sweet flowing breast;

i) Context: Requesting your manager to postpone the meeting

Madam, Would it be a problem if I leave early today?
