The one year anniversary of the war against Ukraine has recently passed. To stand in solidarity with our Ukrainian families we will be wearing yellow and/or blue on Tuesday, March 7.

World Down Syndrome Day (WDSD) is March 21, 2023. On Tuesday, March 21, we are asking our students & their families to wear colorful, fun socks. This will help raise awareness and put some fun into the recognition! Down syndrome is a condition which a person has an extra chromosome. Typically, a baby is born with chromosomes. Babies with Down syndrome have an extra copy of one of these chromosomes; chromosome 21. A medical term for having an extra copy of a chromosome is 'trisomy.' Down syndrome is also referred to as Trisomy 21. This extra copy changes how the baby's body and brain develop, which can cause both mental and physical challenges for the baby.

World Autism Awareness Day is April 2, 2023. To help foster support and show kindness and acceptance in recognition of people with autism, and other neurodiverse individuals we will be having Neurodiversity celebration days. schedule is below. Neurodiversity Celebration Days

April 3-5



Rainbow Monday April 3

The rainbow infinity sign is the symbol for neurodiversity. The full spectrum of colors represents the diversity of the autism spectrum as well as the greater neurodiversity movement. Wear red, orange, yellow, green, blue or purple.

Magnificent mind Tuesday Apr 4

Autism is a neurological variation, which means that the brains of autistic people work differently than the brains of allistic (non-autistic) people. Autism is called a spectrum disorder precisely because it is characterized by a broad range of symptoms and abilities. People with autism can be high-functioning, low-functioning, or somewhere in-between. They can be highly intelligent and verbal, or cognitively challenged and nonverbal.

Dyslexia is a learning disability in reading. People with dyslexia have trouble reading at a good pace and without mistakes. They may also have a hard time with reading comprehension, spelling, and writing. But these challenges aren't a problem with intelligence.

Dyspraxia, also known as developmental co-ordination disorder (DCD), is a common disorder that affects movement and co-ordination. Dyspraxia does not affect your intelligence. It can affect your co-ordination skills – such as tasks requiring balance, playing sports or learning to drive a car.

ADHD stands for attention deficit hyperactivity disorder. It is a medical condition. A person with ADHD has differences in brain development and brain
