

# Steppin' Outdoors: Nature Shapes


This month when you get outdoors, explore the shapes that you find outdoors! Nature is a wondrous place full of shapes, patterns and colors.

#### Gather materials


- Piece of paper

## Try it out!

- 1. Get outdoors and observe the world around you.
- Identify shapes in the environment and record them on the included <u>Shape</u>
   <u>Activity Page</u>..

### Think it over

- What was the most common shape you found?
- Did you see more 2D shapes or 3D shapes?
- What was your favorite part in this activity?



What would you do differently next time?

## Take it further

- Design and build a symmetrical bug using materials found outside.
- Take pictures of the different shapes found in nature and make your own shape book.
- Use the shapes you found to help inspire you to paint a picture!
- Get family involved! If you have a younger sibling, challenge them to find a certain number of objects, such as 3 sticks, 4 red leaves, and 5 acorns.
- Grab a bag and pick up litter. Then explore the different shapes (and materials)
  found in your bag of litter. You could even clean up the litter and use a glue gun
  to make a sculpture out of it!
