

Meet Moderator Role Description

This document serves to give potential meet moderators an understanding of what will be expected of their role at the meets and within the community.

What will I be doing as a meet moderator?

As a meet moderator, your role will include:

- Making sure our community is following our rules and code of conduct whilst attending the meet.
- Help welcoming new attendees into the community, particularly at the pre-meet.
- Filling in to help with the walk if volunteer numbers are not sufficient.
- Ensuring the safety of our attendees.
- Answering any questions attendees may have.
- Documenting any incidents or breaches of the rules.

While you are only expected to follow the above, we welcome any assistance in other roles of the community, such as online moderation. This is optional and we will ask that you only act as a meet moderator during your probation period.

Probation period

New Meet Mods will be put on a 3 meet probation period which will help us gauge what you will be like in this role and if you are a good fit for our team.

This period may be extended to help us make a more definitive decision on offering an invitation to officially join staff or if you cannot attend 3 consecutive meets.

Please note that taking part as a walk volunteer is mandatory during this period as this acts as a benchmark to help review your performance further.
