GRADUATION RATE % (4,5 & 6 year if available):

- 4yr = 67% (86% for students who began and completed their bachelor's degree at Drake)

SPECIALTY PROGRAM ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS: At this time, Drake does not have any specialty program admission requirements. When a student is admitted, they are admitted into the university. Satisfactory academic progress (can vary by major) is needed to advance toward degree requirements.

HIGH SCHOOL COURSE REQUIREMENTS/RECOMMENDATIONS: College prep curriculum is recommended for success at Drake:

- 4 years of English
- 3 years of Math, Science, & Social Sciences (History)
- 2 years of World Language is encouraged but not required for admission

When available, students should consider rigorous coursework <u>aligned to their individual academic ability</u> (i.e. advanced, honors, IB, AP, dual enrollment).

TUITION & FEES, BOARD & ROOM: Drake is a private school so the cost is the same for in-state & out-of-state students:

MISCELLANEOUS (NEW DEVELOPMENTS, UNIQUE PROGRAMS OR FEATURES):

- <u>Drake University Athletics</u> compete at the NCAA Division I level and offer 16 men's & women's sports. Drake is one of four Division I institutions in the state of Iowa and the ONLY private Division Linstitution in the state.
 - o 380 of the 3000 undergraduate students on campus are athletes
 - football is a "non-scholarship" sport
- Drake's <u>Crew Scholars Program</u> is an academic excellence and leadership development program
 for incoming students of color. The program has <u>proven successful in increasing students of
 color retention and graduation rates</u> (both surpassing rates for any other group of non-Crew
 Drake students of any racial or ethnic demographic).
- Drake offers a number of <u>centers and institutes</u> that provide experiential learning opportunities for students across a number of academic disciplines.
- May 2024, Drake University earned its first <u>Missouri Valley Conference All-Sports</u>
 <u>Championship</u> in school history, becoming just the second private institution in MVC history to earn the honor (and first private institution in 63 years).
- Opening January 2025, <u>Johansen Student Center</u> which will house a number of student-focused entities including Drake's first dedicated intercultural space, The Sammons Intercultural Center.
