## Submission of FCC notes to CDS

Notes in CDS can be either 'public' (visible to everyone) or 'restricted' (visible only to the members of the 'community(ies)' the note is included into). Currently we have created two FCC communities:

- "FCC Physics and Experiments Internal Notes"
- "FCC Physics and Experiments Note Submission"

The latter should be used to submit your note - some details on the workflows are given below

### Get the form to submit your note:

- Go to the web site of the new CDS service: <a href="https://repository.cern">https://repository.cern</a> and log in (top right box) with your CERN credentials.
- Click on "Communities" in the banner on the top [1]
- In the "Search communities" box, enter "FCC" and click on the search button (the magnifying glass).
- Click on "FCC Physics and Experiments Note Submission"
- Click on the green "New upload" box, in the top-right of the page [2]

#### Fill the form:

- Upload the pdf of your note (click on the black "Upload files" box", or drag and drop the file)
  - Note that you can also upload additional files, for example the png or pdf files
    of the figures that are in your note. You are encouraged to do so, at least for
    the final version of your note (think of speakers who may want to present your
    results in a conference talk, for example). You should first upload the main pdf
    of your note; and then the figures.
- Digital Object Identifier: answer the question "Do you already have a DOI identifier"
  - o a priori, check "No" for a new FCC note, and click on "Get a DOI now"
- Field "Resource type": in the pull-down menu, select what fits best, for example
  "Publication / preprint" for a note that you plan to submit to arXiv and to a journal, or
  "Publication / Technical note" if the note contains some 'technical' material and does
  not target a publication, or "Presentation" if that is a talk at a conference / workshop,
  or "Publication / Thesis", etc
- Fill the "Title" field
- Field "Creators": click on "Add creator" and enter all the authors of the note:
  - enter your name (or that of your co-editors) in the text menu [3], and select the right person if the system has found you (your co-editor) [3a]. In case the system did not find the person (that may happen even if the person has an

ORCID id), just fill the fields "Family name", "Given name" and "Affiliation". In the field "role", select e.g. "Contact person" or "Editor".

- Field "Description": you can copy-paste your abstract, or enter a short description of the content of the note.
- Field "Licences": by default, "Creative Commons Attribution 4.0 International" is chosen. Leave it as it is.
- Field "Contributors": in case you want to list other people, who are not listed in the "creators" field. Note that only the "creators" will appear as authors.
- Field "Awards" : click on "Add award", check "Future Circular Collider Innovation Study", and click on the black "Add award" box [4]
- In the "visibility" field, in the right-most part of the page [5]:
  - "Full record": select "Public" (public should appear in green)
  - "Files only": select "Restricted" (restricted should appear in red)
- In the field "Draft" in the right-most part of the page [6] : click on "Save draft", and then on "Submit for review"


#### **Next steps (for information):**


- You will receive an email that acknowledges your submission request.
- One of the "curators" of the community (currently, the PED coordination team) will make some basic technical checks of the request (e.g., check that the note is indeed a PED note and not an accelerator physics note, which should go to a different community), and "accept" your request. You may receive an email that informs you that your request has been accepted (this confirmation is not in place yet but it should be implemented soon). At this stage, the note remains visible only to the PED coordination team. Please, do not accept your own submission even if you are a curator.
- One of the curators will include your note:
  - either into the "FCC Physics and Experiments Internal Notes" community. In which case your notes becomes an 'internal FCC note', visible to all members of the "FCC Physics and Experiments Internal Notes" community (currently still limited to the PED coordination team, but will be extended to all members of a FCC PED group)
  - or into a community dedicated to your note, in view of a light review of your note before it becomes an 'internal FCC note'. At this stage, your note will be accessible to the PED coordination team, to the conveners of the relevant WG, and to referee(s) who will be asked to help with the review, possibly to the WG at large. This "paper community" will be used to collect comments that you will receive, and your answers to these comments. Once this WG review is completed, your note will be included either into the "FCC Physics and Experiments Internal Notes" and become an internal note accessible to FCC at large, or into a more restricted community (to be created) if your note needs to remain confidential.

 When the note is deemed mature enough to become public, the corresponding record will be updated, and the files will be made public instead of restricted. At this stage, the pdf will be accessible in CDS by everyone.


#### Additional information:


- A given record can be updated easily: you can upload a new version of the note, you can correct or update the metadata (e.g. the list of 'creators' or of 'contributors'), so do not be afraid, mistakes can be fixed!
  - o go to your record, and click on "new version" (green button)
- If you want to upload additional files for example the figures to an existing record: you need to make an update of the record, even if the note has not changed.
- Other communities will be created depending on the needs. For example, another
  community (to be created) will extend the "Internal notes" community (i.e. people who
  signed up to a FCC-ee PED group) to include also people from the Scientific
  Advisory Committee, who will review the mid-term report, such that they can access
  to our notes too.
- If it happens that the CDS system often logs you out (observed on Safari, although that may be settings-dependent), try with another browser.







