

Comparison - Sample Nature Journal Entry

What unique details can you discover by comparing two similar objects found in nature?











Materials/Tools

- Science Notebook
- 2 similar objects found in nature to compare (e.g. leaves, flowers, fruit, seeds, shells, etc.)
- Pencil
- Curiosity and observation skills
- Magnifying lens (optional)
- Colored pencils (optional)

Steps for Recording Your Observations

- 1. Use the activity worksheet to title and sketch each object on its own side.
- 2. Record in words, pictures and numbers the similarities and differences (i.e. color, shape, texture, patterns, features, scent, etc.) you observe while comparing the objects using all your senses.
- 3. Record any questions you have about the objects. What do you wonder?
- 4. Record any thoughts you have to explain the observations you made.
