CHRIST IS RISEN, HE IS RISEN INDEED!

We have all raced as kids up hillsides, on beaches, across fields. My brother outran me once to a jetty on a beach in Long Island, and suddenly stopped at the rocks. I caught up and saw him staring in wonder at a beautiful tan starfish that had washed up from the water. "Now that is a sign of God", he said looking up at the sky.

Peter and John had their own race to the tomb on Easter morning, and their own sign of enormous significance from God. At the first sight of the empty tomb, they did not realize the fulfillment of Jesus promise that he would rise on the third day. Then John, the first to believe, went inside the tomb and was overwhelmed with the truth of the Resurrection. He saw and believed. It is a phrase that must be repeated endlessly in our own lives.

Let us recall that they may have lingered a moment there and examined the burial cloths. They would have noticed the faint imprint of the scourged body of our Lord with its nail marks and his face marred by brutal suffering. This cloth was kept as a sacred relic and is the venerated Shroud of Turin. The resurrected Christ will never keep us far from the signs of the Passion he suffered for us.—Fr. Donald Haggerty.
