I am a Pearl Harbor survivor, and I was interviewed by you, on your staff, some time in the past here at Newport.

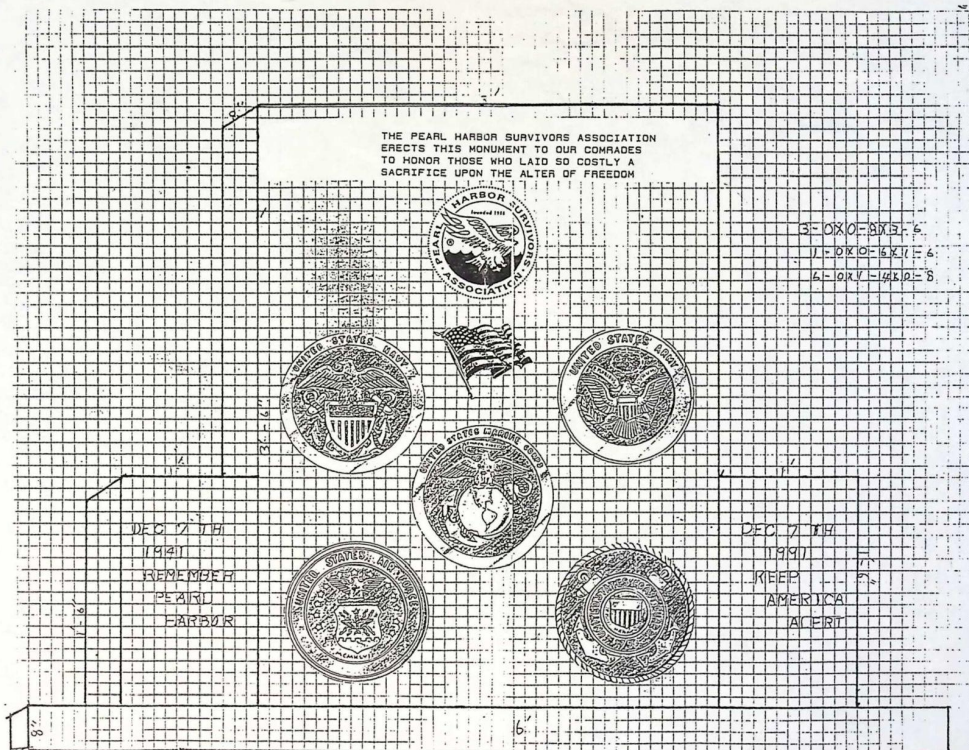
