

Sample Program Map

- Because students join our program from various academic backgrounds with different degree requirements (e.g. transfers, Honors College, University Studies), the following map offers only a **sample** degree completion plan for a fictional student who will complete the BA+MA (Thesis) degree.
- In most cases, specific courses can be taken in different terms or years than suggested.
- Students should speak with the Department's Coordinator for Graduate Studies for advice regarding their specific plan.

Total yearly credits = 25; plus 20 B+M shared credits = 45 total degree credits
