**How to prepare the summary?** In general, the abstract should contain one to four pages. The text is usually formatted for the A4 page size, with top and bottom margins (2.5 cm), left and right 3 cm. Remembering that it must be made in justified mode with simple line spacing. Regarding the structure, the abstract must contain the following elements with the nomenclatures highlighted: Introduction, Objectives, Methodology, Discussions and Possible Results. Regarding the Introduction, it is recommended to write up to a thousand words. Justifying the problem studied clearly. Objectives (general and specific) should be listed side by side according to the structure of this model; In the Methodology we recommend that you elaborate as concisely and clearly as possible. This way, the reader will understand and can even reproduce the procedures used. The orientation is also not to exceed a thousand words. In the Discussions and Possible Results it must contain the data obtained so far. The discussion of the results must be based on and compared with the theoretical framework used in other extension works, indicating its relevance, advantages and possible limitations. Tables and Figures should be avoided in the expanded summary. The Final Considerations will be elaborated with the verb in the present indicative, in short sentences and based on the objectives and results of the expanded summary.

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**GENERAL STANDARDS**

The texts must be presented in Word for Windows; upper and lower margins 2.5 cm; right and left margins 3cm; Calibri source; font size 12 points; simple leading spacing; justified alignment; pages should not be numbered. These guidelines must be strictly followed by the authors and their failure to comply may imply the non-acceptance of the text by the members of the Technical-Scientific Committee.

With respect to Citations and Notes: observe the NBR 10520/2002 of the Brazilian Association of Technical Standards (ABNT). Notes should be avoided. When necessary, they should appear at the end of the text. References should also appear at the end of the text, with only those cited in the course of the work being presented.
