VILLAGE OF PINE VALLEY

Along with several residents from the community, I attended a public meeting last month hosted by a developer who has submitted plans for a housing community on Frazer Road just south of Frenchtown Road.

Our County Councilman Dave Tackett sent out a letter to residents. The first meeting was cancelled due to Hodgson Vo-Tech early dismissal that day because of the Nor'easters we were hit with.

In a nutshell, residents were worried about looking into our backyards and seeing

townhouses where we used to enjoy everything Mother Nature had to offer naturally.

It was made very clear that would not be the results of the new housing development plans.

The site is roughly 150 acres with only 27 acres being disturbed by the proposed construction and 123 acres protected as Natural Resources.

You can check out the large yellow the County posts at proposed construction sites. Look at Note 32 that states "Any area designated for protection as a Natural Resource ... per NCC Unified Development Code is hereby protected by a Conservation Easement that shall run in perpetuity for the benefit of New Castle County".

DeIDoT PROPOSED UPGRADES TO ROUTE 40 & ROUTE 896 INTERSECTION

On May 1 I attended a public meeting at Keen Elementary School hosted by DeIDoT in regards to their proposed upgrades to the intersection of Rt. 40 & SR.896.

DeIDot has 3 different options. Each option is different in dollar amount, length of construction schedule, acquisition of adjoin properties, etc.
