Examples of What You can Do:

1. Wishing TGfU a happy anniversary

- a. Picture- staff/students holding signage (e.g., TGfU, happy anniversary, 40th anniversary etc.), aerial photo of your staff/students
- b. Video- staff/students saying hello from their institution and Country wishing TGfU a happy anniversary

2. Extended Video

- a. Discussion on what TGfU means to you and how it has affected your practice
- b. Guiding Questions: What would you like to say to David Bunker and Rod Thorpe about TGfU?
What impact has the early TGfU work met to you as a teacher, teacher educator and/or researcher?
Send your anniversary goodwill messages for David and Rod

3. Practical Examples

Video clip(s) or Pictures of you, your colleagues and/or students participating in games-based approaches activities

4. Email Tribute

If you are not able to contribute a video, then you could provide an email tribute answering the questions above or sending your anniversary best wishes. These will be included throughout the presentation.

Key Requirements:

For your contributions to be included we need them to be standardised in the following formats

- **Picture files** should be **PNG or JPEG**
- **Video files** should be **MP4 or WMV**
- All files shared need to include **Participating group(s), Affiliation, Country** (*these will be included in the credits at the end of the video*) and **Contact Information**
 - E.g., Professor Linda Griffin (University of Massachusetts Amherst, USA), PETE Students (University of Sunderland, UK), Year 3 pupils (Thornton Elementary School, USA), Sunderland Spartans (University of Sunderland, UK)
- Please ensure you have **copyright permission** and **permission from participants to photograph/film**
- **Submission-** please submit your files to tgfu.info@gmail.com
