### Exploring the Legal Roots of Race and Whiteness with Dr. Jack Chin

Join UCSD HCP to learn from guest speaker, Dr. Gabriel "Jack" Chin, Professor of Law at UC Davis. Professor Chin is the Edward L. Barrett Jr. Chair and the Martin Luther King Jr. Professor of Law at King Hall. His work includes persuading the California Supreme Court to admit Hong Hen Chang to the bar in 2015 after they denied him because of his race in 1890, and leading an effort to repeal anti-Asian alien land laws which were still on the books in Florida, Kansas, New Mexico, and Wyoming. We will hear from Professor Chin and then discuss classroom applications with fellow educators.



### New Resource—Organization of 2021-22 CAST!

Check out the new flyer <u>Organization of the California Science Test (CAST)</u>, now available to assist educators in understanding how the 2021–22 CAST is organized. It is posted along with other CAST resources on the CAASPP CAST web page.

Included on the new flyer are the following:

- § A graphic presenting the six CAST segments and the student survey
- § A breakdown of the number of items in each segment
- § A recommendation for when to pause the test during administration

Students taking the 2021–22 CAST will receive fewer test questions overall, and each student will now receive a minimum of three performance tasks. These changes come as a result of the implementation this year of the revised State Board of Education-approved CAST blueprint.


