Growing Up 2: Growing Up Serving

John 13:1-17

It was just before the Passover Festival. Jesus knew that the hour had come for him to leave this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end. The evening meal was in progress, and the devil had already prompted Judas, the son of Simon Iscariot, to betray Jesus. Jesus knew that the Father had put all things under his power, and that he had come from God and was returning to God; so he got up from the meal, took off his outer clothing, and wrapped a towel around his waist. After that, he poured water into a basin and began to wash his disciples' feet, drying them with the towel that was wrapped around him. He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, "Lord, are you going to wash my feet?" Jesus replied, "You do not realize now what I am doing, but later you will understand." "Then, Lord," Simon Peter replied, "not just my feet but my hands and my head as well!" Jesus answered, "Those who have had a bath need only to wash their feet; their whole body is clean. And you are clean, though not every one of you." For he knew who was going to betray him, and that was why he said not every one was clean. When he had finished washing their feet, he put on his clothes and returned to his place/ "Do you understand what I have done for you?" he asked them. "You call me 'Teacher' and 'Lord' and rightly so, for that is what I am.

Introduction

In this series of Growing Up, we have heard of how mothers learn to entrust their children to God as they raise their children who are a new generation in God's kingdom. We learn that we are a community and it takes a whole village to raise a child in His Kingdom. Yet how do we serve each other in God's Kingdom here in DUMC? Pastor Adrian mentioned in the scriptures of John 13: 1-17 how Jesus himself came to show his disciples how to serve each other by washing their feet. It is His Love and Compassion for all of them that lead him to set the example of serving in humility by washing their feet. He in turn asked them to do the same for each other. So our meditation of the Word will change our lives as we serve God through serving one another.

BIG IDEA: Serving one another is not only a <u>privilege</u>, but a command from God

1. Serving one another as <u>Christ</u> have served you <u>John 13:1,17</u>

Serving one another is a norm if we are in Christ. We don't need a great plan but the presence of the Holy Spirit and the Word and the simple act of hearing and listening to each other will enable us to serve God. Just by obeying his company's call to lead a project to help raise the standards of Primary school children in East Malaysia, Pastor Adrian was able to meet a village headman and hear about the plight of the village living in poverty and be engaged in plans to break the cycle of poverty. God touched his heart to start an economic project. In following Jesus to serve the community, hence the hearts of 42 people were touched and came to hear the message of Christ. We too can serve during a time such as this. We can serve by fellowship. Call a friend and lend your ears to comfort and pray. You will be blessed.

2. When we serve God we need to be <u>mindful</u> of our sinful nature John 13:8-11 Ephesians 5:26 2Timothy3:16-17

When Jesus told Peter that he will not be part of Christ unless Jesus washes his feet, it symbolises that we as people of God do sin or 'get dirty' and thus need to do life long washing or cleansing continually through the Holy Spirit present in us as we repent of our sinful nature. Be mindful we do not get ensnared by the Ministry until it becomes our idol. Thus let the Word equip us for every good work for His Glory. Pastor Adrian was reminded of the time when his evangelistic team in the UK was

having a Poster War against the LBGT community who was competing for the poster space but God reminded them on how they have idolised their work. Yet when he reached out to apologise to their secretary, it opened the door needed for her to seek God at their evangelistic healing rally.

3 Seeking <u>preeminence</u> while serving God or one another displeases God Luke 22:24 Matthew 19:30

In the secular world we see many seeking to show themselves to be more superior than others by exposing their talents and also advertising their successes on social media. We see or hear of evangelists who publicise their ministry to the point that people seek them instead of God for miracle healings. Let us be mindful not to become ensnared. However, we know of many serving in ministries behind the scenes by gathering for prayer huddles before serving in their various ministries such as the DEW crew, Children's Church helpers ,volunteers for Foodbank, etc in DUMC. Even now when church is online, our volunteers are serving tirelessly to enable the congregation to worship every weekend, have children's church meetings online and delivering food to the needful. That is serving selflessly and for His Glory. Let us be reminded that we are here to serve and not to become the greatest among all.

Conclusion

God desires us to serve one another in humility, love and compassion. But let us not forget to serve out of love for God as He serves us in washing our sins our whole life long. Let us serve out of a love for God.

Thank you Jesus for saving us by dying on the cross to take away our sins so that we can have eternal life.

- Is there anything holding you back from serving in a ministry or in CG?
- What is one area of strength that you believe God has blessed you with that is currently lying dormant? How might you still use it to serve people?
- Do you feel humbled or superior when helping someone who is going through a difficult time? Did it help you grow spiritually?
- How do you know that God is with you through the toughest times of your life?
- Has serving over time changed your initial reason(s) for serving?

Question Bank (Extra questions you can use to bring discussion further as you see fit):

• We tend to choose a life of convenience and comfort when our lives are already packed. How might that also play out in how we serve people? Do we tend to also choose comfort and convenience in our serving others?


