The trail was built in 1971 through a partnership with the Lions Clubs of Virginia and the Lee Ranger District. 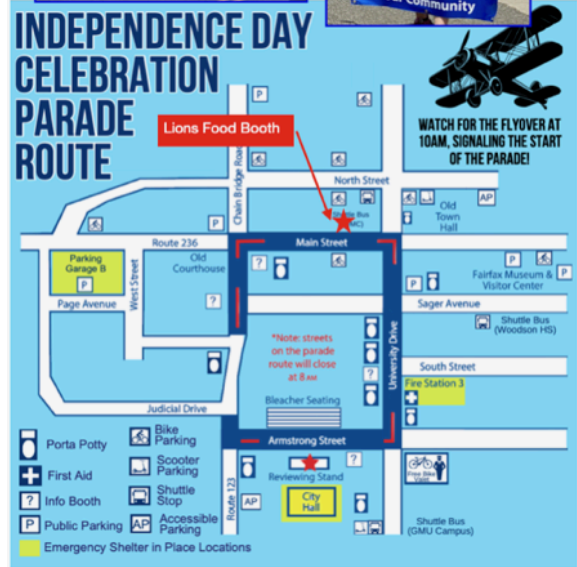

Shepherd's Center Fairfax Burke (SCFB) SCFB is dedicated to helping older adults continue to live independently, and to providing enrichment and social networking opportunities that keep life exciting and rewarding for them. Programs include Accompanied Medical Transportation and Companion Shopping (for older people who are no longer able to drive), Friendly Callers/Visitors (for people who are mostly homebound), low-cost exercise and yoga classes (to promote strength, balance and flexibility), and Lunch N' Life, and Out and About which all provide mental stimulation and socialization opportunities.

In April our volunteers provided:

- 258 no cost rides to medical appointments and necessity shopping trips
- 12 Chair Yoga classes with 465 participants
- 124 Calls and 7 visits through our Friendly Caller/Friendly Visitor program .
- Handy Helper Two Tasks
- Book Club – 1 meeting – 13 attendees. One book discussed.
- Lunch N'Life – 69 Participants
- Out and About – No events
