

Annotate a Movie Review Using Diigo Hi-Liter and Sticky Note Tools

Objective:

1. SW identify common elements of movie reviews by reading and annotating a movie review of their choice using Diigo.

Find, read and annotate a movie review using Diigo. Feel free to use one of the many [movie reviews I have tagged on Diigo](#). Try to add your annotations from the Printed Webpage View as we discussed in class. Diigo saves your annotations as a public webpage. You can find the link to your annotated page under the Share Tab in the Diigolet Toolbar.

[Write a post on your blog](#) about the review and share the annotated link. Be prepared to share and discuss your review next class.

Directions for hi-liting and adding sticky notes:

- Use **YELLOW** to hi-lite all text dealing with the **Literary Aspects**: Plot, Characters, Conflict, Setting, Theme, Point of View, Mood, Symbolism
- Use **GREEN** to hi-lite all text dealing with the **Dramatic Aspects**: Acting, Sets, Costumes, Make-Up
- Use **BLUE** to hi-lite all text dealing with the **Cinematic Aspects**: Cinematography (camera angles, composition), Lighting, Music & Sound Effects, Editing, Special Effects
- Use **PINK** to hi-lite all text dealing with the **writer's opinion** of the film

Sticky Notes:

- Add a note by the sentence (or sentences) that refer to Theme.
- Identify the tone of the movie review: Serious, funny, sarcastic? Add a minimum of two Diigo sticky notes to support your idea of tone.
- Add a note at the bottom right of the review stating the total word count of the piece.
