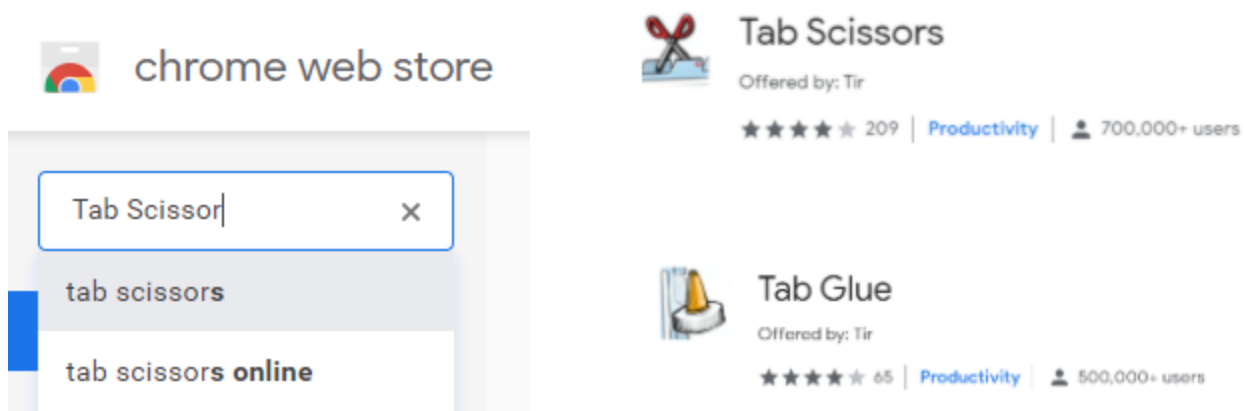


Do you wish you had two monitors? Try split screen with Tab Scissors and Tab Glue


Adding the Extension to Chrome

Tab Scissors and Tab Glue are productivity tools to help with multitasking and organization of your desktop using split screen. The first step to add the extension is to go to the chrome web store: <https://chrome.google.com/webstore/category/extensions?hl=en>

In the search box type in “Tab Scissors” then follow these directions, then come back and type in “Tab Glue.”

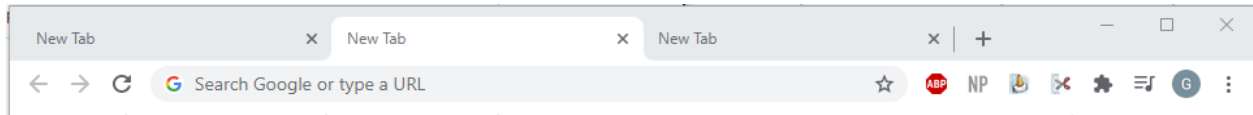


Add to Chrome


Once you have pulled up either Tab Scissors or Tab Glue, click the button to add the extension to your web browser. Once the extension is added it will be in the top right of your chrome browser, for example: . If the icons do not appear, click the puzzle piece icon to view all extensions. Click the small pin icon next to the extension to add to your extension bar.

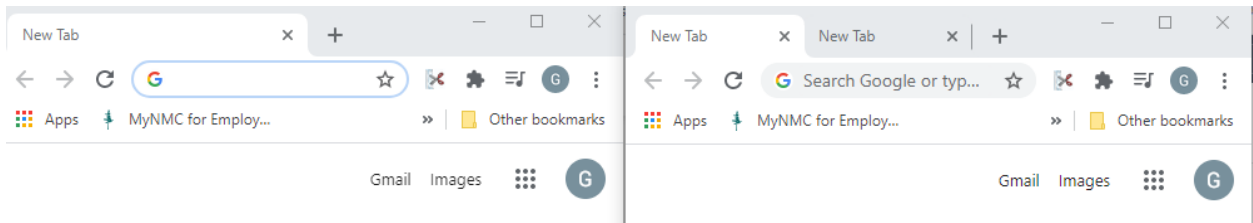
Tab Scissors

Once you have both of these extensions added, open up a few chrome tabs. Notice how although there are different web pages open, it is still only using the one Google Chrome window. To separate these, use the **Tab Scissors** extension you just installed.




Click on the tab you wish to split. In this example I have the middle tab selected. Next click on

the small  icon in the top right corner. This will perform a split, and evenly stack the now 2 chrome windows side by side.



Tab Glue

Now that you have two separate chrome windows open, let's use **Tab Glue** to put them back

into one window with multiple extensions. In the top right corner click on the  icon. This will combine all of your open chrome windows into one. Keep in mind, this will glue ALL chrome windows that are currently opened or minimized. If by chance you glue too many tabs together, you can simply use the **Tab Scissors** extensions to split them up again.
