Humanities I Syllabus Fall Term - 2015

Welcome Cougars and Cougar Parents! On behalf of the entire Humanities I team, we welcome you to our program. We are here for you and plan on making this a successful and exciting term.

What is Humanities I?

Ninth-grade Humanities I is a two-block course. Technology skills are built into the Humanities curriculum. One course is 9th grade English / Language Arts and the other course is Geography. Literacy skills, such as reading, writing, speaking, and listening, are emphasized in both classes. In addition, students will use geographic tools to study the physical and cultural characteristics of places and regions. This course is aligned to the CCSS, the Common Core State Standards for California, in both English /Language Arts and Literacy in Social Science.

A sampling of skills students will gain:

- In-depth understanding of various regions and their cultures
- Strategic online research skills and the incorporation of Empower3000 to enhance reading comprehension
- Computer skills such as word processing, slide presentations, video editing, multimedia projects, and web page design
- Reading and vocabulary development through imaginative and informational text
- Academic writing skills with detailed instruction in content development, organization, style, and grammar
- Improved public speaking skills
- Introduction to rhetorical analysis, gaining familiarity with rhetorical devices and the language of argument and persuasion

Our units of study will be housed under essential questions. Inside those units, students will explore the following ideas:

- How do perceptions influence how people see others?
- How does culture influence human interactions?
- How does your journey define you?

In English class, students will read *To Kill a Mockingbird*, informational texts, visual texts, a self-selected novel to be read in Literature Circles, and *The Odyssey*.

In Geography, students will read informational texts, visual texts, graphs, charts, maps, and other data.

Both courses will also utilize as many multimedia resources as are relevant and rigorous to the unit under study.

Check your student's grade online

- We will use an online gradebook through Illuminate, our student information system. It is a full-featured, completely secure Internet site that allows the parent/student viewer to log in and view only your child's grade using the unique log in information for your child. Please check it regularly.
- Your login information for Illuminate will come on a separate handout

Competencies:

- Students must pass competencies in the following areas in order to advance to 10th grade:
 - a. Oral Presentations (**two** out of three must pass competency)
 - b. Process Essay Writing (all must pass competency)
 - c. Timed Essay Writing (**two** must pass competency)
- College prep passing grade = 3- on a 6 point rubric
- Honors passing grade = 4- on a 6 point rubric If all competencies are not met, the student will have to remediate his / her deficiency with his / her teacher or earn an F in the Humanities I course.

College Prep / Honors:

- Regardless of any GATE identifications in middle school, SCHS does not "track" students; therefore all students with motivation and ability have the opportunity to perform honors work and earn honors credit. We realize that students in the Honors program may be interested in Advanced Placement classes in their future years of high school. In order to prepare them for the academic rigor they will encounter, we feel it is necessary to prepare them. As a result, students enrolled in the Honors program will be expected to:
- Complete differentiated classwork and homework that requires deep thought
- Write in-class insightful essays using organization, correct grammar, spelling and punctuation
- Read 1-2 additional novels and complete accompanying assignments such as dialectical journals research and essays.

- Maintain a grade of a B in Humanities, or be dropped from the program.
- If your child meets the above requirements, they will be eligible to earn an A worth 5 credits instead of 4, affecting their overall GPA.
- If you are interested in reading further about the expectations of an honors student, ask your student for a copy of the honors agreement letter which must be signed separately.

Homework policy:

- Late homework is accepted for half-credit, within the unit of study.
- All late projects and essays will receive **half-credit** when turned in the day after they are due. After one day, the assignment may be turned in for competency, but will receive no credit.
- Communicate with your teachers if you have extenuating circumstances.

Make-up Assignments:

- Students may not make up class work or tests missed as a result of a truancy.
- It is the student's responsibility to get missed work due to an excused absence. Students must request missed work and turn in work from an absence without being prompted by teachers.
- Students should check online websites for materials and lessons that they have missed. Most assignments can be accessed from home.
